September 2016 we all thought Tower Park Resort was in our past. As it turned out we were mistaken! The folks at Jellystone saw that we were a responsible group and welcomed us back! Yes, we were not as spread out as in years past, but in my opinion this tighter grouping made for a more social meet.

Jellystone has again, invited us back! They have blocked off **September 16-23, 2018** for our group to use campgrounds 2 and 3. They are in the process of renovating campground 1 and hopefully we will be able to use that area also. If campground 1 becomes available to us I would like to see the larger RV's and 5th wheels in campgrounds 1 and 3. Thus leaving campground 2 (in the middle) open for smaller RV's, tent trailers and tents. A map of the Jellystone Tower Park Resort can be found at Towerparkresorts.com.

Hello Everyone:

It was great seeing so many of you at the Fall swapmeet at Tower Park. I had a great time once again and wish to thank everyone that made it and those that brought vehicles. As 2017 winds down, we are heading into the Holiday season. Next on the radar is Veterans Day celebrations. The Events section has several parades and other festivities to take your vehicles out and honor all of the men and women who have served in the United States military. I hope to see you out there.

Rather than duplicate what Joann has said in her Wagon Mistress Report, I would like to mention a few things discussed with the Tower Park management team. As you have read, we have been invited back next September. They have once again said they would relax some of the rules for our group. We can park for free up on the levy and there will be no fee for those that come out for the day. We can park tow trailers in the same area out by the front gate. If you were at Tower a couple weeks back, you would have seen that Jellystone has cleaned out Camp Ground One and construction was under way to put full hookups and new pads for pull throughs. There could be 30 available to the MVCC next September.

Many members have talked to me about Camp Petaluma. Plans are for the board to meet there in January. Before that I have plans to meet with Woody, the camp ground owner, and try to work out some of the concerns you the members have voiced to me and the board. This includes parking and the day-use fees. April 2018 will be here before you know it, so plan to get your vehicles ready. As you know, this is a driving meet, and I am sure there will be a couple rides like many enjoyed this past April.

If the fields are not soggy, we will have plenty of parking. We are talking about other solutions in case they are. We will need to address shuttle solutions if we have to park those without campsites offsite. KOA has offered the onsite RV storage lot to those with campsites for parking tow trailers. The "Dodge Boys" once again plan to gather next spring at Camp Petaluma. If you have a Dodge military vehicle, please plan on bringing it out. Stay tuned for more info as the details are worked out.

As always, if you would like to volunteer to help with the swapmeet or if you have a special skill like sign making let me or one of the VPs know. "Keep em Rolling, Floating and Flying."
