




49'er Resort April 14-20 2019

It is time for anyone that pre-registered and was assigned a site to get your deposit into the 49'er. The 49'er will be accepting deposits between November 15 and December 31, 2018. Their number is 209.245.6981. Please identify yourself as MVCC. As a member of the MVCC you will get a reduced rate for stay at the 49'er resort. Non MVCC members will pay the going rate. If you know of anyone that is not a member and plans to camp with us, please let them know of the significant savings by becoming a member. I was informed by Donna Mambretti that the 49'er offers express check-in. If your stay is paid in full 3 days prior to your arrival they will have your packet ready and waiting for you. No need to stop into the office to check-in. Of course, you still will need to stop by the office to make a deposit for next year. Anyone that is tent camping or planning to camp in their open truck or trailer will need to register with me. Camping at the Amador County Fairgrounds is \$25./night for dry camping (no water or electric) These sites must be paid in full in advance of your arrival. Simply multiply the daily rate by the number of nights staying. Checks for fairgrounds camping should be sent to MVCC Treasurer, 850 Elm Street, Gustine, CA 95322 Please include a note explaining what the check is for.

A 100 Year Old Military Vehicle still "Crawling" today.

This year, 2018, is the centenary of the end of World War One (WWI), 1918 "The War to End all Wars", and this year's "2018 Best of The West, Memorial Day Tractor Show" in Santa Margarita, California did not let this fact go unnoticed.

Last year a WWI Army G-002, 5 ton, Holt Artillery Tractor "Gun Tractor" was discovered in amongst the vast number of historical tractors on display at the "2017 BOTW Tractor Show". (MVCC Newsletter, 2017, Vol. XL, No. 7. P. 15) This year's event showcased the G-002 as part of the CAMP PATRIOT interactive presentation in recognition of this anniversary. With the collaboration and cooperation of the owner, Tom Madden, this 100 year old Historical Military Vehicle came to life as part of the Tractor Parades driven by James E. Bundgaard CW4 (USA Retired). Having operated various crawler tractors in his youth, driving the G-002 was a "bucket list" experience that was not on his bucket list. Adding to the live operation of the tractor was his complete original WWI, enlisted Artilleryman Uniform and field gear making this demonstration unique not only for the public and as well as for the other historical tractor owners.

CAMP PATRIOT hosted Boy Scout Troop 123, Santa Margarita, California, as well as a privately owned extensive collection of circa '40s Boy Scout uniforms and artifacts that filled a 16 x 32 foot G.P. Medium tent and accompanied by a small group of Scouts acting as docents in original period uniforms. As a group, the scouts were responsible for directing traffic in the parking area, spent the days and nights in the Bivouac, and performed Morning and Evening colors and other activities.

(Sean Tashma) Down across the creek, up the hill across the narrow gauge tracks, through the Historic Hacienda, near the airstrip, was a contingent of 15 to 20 local Historical Military Vehicles ranging from Jeeps, WC's, 5 Ton, and Half Track; all had their own operational parades during the three day event. The Santa Margarita Historical Ranch airstrip is long enough to accommodate a B-25J Mitchell "Executive Sweet" from Camarillo, CA and other single engine historical aircraft with the accompanying rides and low level fly-over's and high performance maneuvers.




