

The LONG process of getting Froggy registered began. Something interesting I has was the original pink slip from 1948 when the first owner bought it at the government auction, that was kinda neat. The next was to gather up all the sheet metal for the sand blaster. After the blasting was done I picked up all the parts and started the body work. I started metal finishing the small dents , welded holes and straightened up the rear single wheel fenders that are the rarest WW2 truck fenders you will ever find . One of the fenders was pretty rough so I had to learn how to use an English Wheel to get the ripples and bad dents out . I always like to do all my body work with some small imperfection to add character. Stay Tuned for my next installment .

Hang on to your hats folks, it's gonna be another crazy ride! The MVCC is moving our April 2019 encampment and swap to the **49er Village RV Resort**, **18265n Hwy 49**, **Plymouth**, **CA. April 14-20**, **2019.** Jellystone didn't appreciate how wonderful we were and kicked us to the curb....again!

To be pre-registered for a site please send name, phone number, MVCC member number, type of site needed as well as length of RV, truck/trailer and number of nights staying to MVCCcampmistress@yahoo.com. A reply e-mail will provide site number assigned and how and when to make a deposit to the 49er.

There have been some questions as to what constitutes an RV. An RV is a vehicle or trailer that is or has been designed with living paces. Examples: motor home, camper van, 5<sup>th</sup> wheel, truck camper, travel trailer, toy-hauler. The contract that was signed with the 49er states, "no tents, no sleeping in utility trailer, no sleeping in trailers or tucks with canvas top." If you were assigned a site and plan on camping in your utility trailer, pick-up truck bed or deuce.....Don't! This is our first time at this resort and we don't want your action to reflect badly on the MVCC. Please contact me at the above e-mail address so that we can work together to find the best site for you.

49er rates for our event are a follows with a 4 night minimum. Rally rate are available from April 13 to April 24, 2019. A one night deposit will hold your site with payment in full upon check in. At this time there are no cottages available. However, I will be keeping a wait lit in case of any cancellations.

1&2 bedroom cottage \$217./night includes tax Studio cottage \$147./night includes tax waterfront (WF) premium site average at \$59./night

standard/premium sites average \$48.50/night

check in 1pm \$20. early check in fee

check out 12pm \$20. late check out

The Amador County Fairgrounds will be the area for tenting. It backs up to the 49er Resort and there is a walk through gate from the fairgrounds to the 49er. The fairgrounds will provide limited water/electric sites as well as dry camping sites. At this time there are no water/electric sites available. I will be keeping a wait list for water/electric sites in case of cancellation. Registration for tent camping can be made through me at MVCCcampmistress@yahoo.com. A reply e-mail will explain how and when to make payment. Rates are as follow with no minimum stay.

Dry tent \$25./night

Water/Electric \$35./night (Bring extension cord)

There is no shade at the fairgrounds nor picnic tables, please place accordingly.

Payment for tenting needs to be paid in full prior to check in at the fairgrounds. Simply multiply the rate by the number of nights staying and send a check to the MVCC Treasurer. MVCC will then write one check to cover cost of tenting to the fairground.

All guest, visitor and dropped trailer parking will be at the fairground at no charge.




