
And the Sherman goes to Rick McClendon!




of those parts are heavy as anyone who's picked up any WW2 era radio knows. It's a small world after all. Thank you ebay, lol...



Greetings from the North and Happy 2022! Hope you're finding time this winter to work on your military vehicle. Camp Plymouth is just around the corner!

I always say every military vehicle has a story, so here's the story of my '45 Willys MB, USMC front line ambulance jeep, also known as the "Holden Ambjeep". But first, a little about USMC front line ambulance jeeps: The Marines wanted a small, agile vehicle that could carry their wounded (and also their dead) from the front lines back to Medical Aid Stations, resulting in a contract with Holden Motors of Australia for the first 200 modified jeeps. Modifications included a "corpsman door" cut into the rear panel, a storage box replacing the front passenger seat with a door built into the right side of the tub, and a stretcher rack made of 1" round steel tube designed to carry two stretchers. The Marines went on assemble about 700 more ambjeeps at Camp Pendleton in California, using "stretcher kits" supplied by Holden Motors.

The first 200 ambjeeps were modified '42 Willys MB, Navy contract jeeps. The next 500 were modified '43/'44 Ford GPWs (not Navy contact jeeps) and the remaining ambjeeps were modified '45 Willys MB jeeps. Unless they were heavily damaged, most ambjeeps stayed with their units and returned with them to the States, while other vehicles were left behind on the Pacific Islands. Some remained on Stateside bases and never went overseas. Some served in the occupation of Japan and some served in Korea.

Back around 2014 I saw an ad for a 1945 Willys Jeep. Looking at the pictures, I recognized it as an original Holden type USMC front line ambulance jeep. I had already restored a '43 GPW ambulance jeep, so I knew what details to look for. I wasn't looking for another ambjeep, just browsing the ad, but small details like tie-down brackets, relocated side handle, modified right side of the tub and the small door in the rear panel were clues to this jeep's past life as an ambulance jeep. It was Bubbafied into a hunting jeep, complete with a rifle rack and larger tires, but not extensively modified like some I've seen. I let it sit for a month before driving to the bay area to take a look at it.





The '45 was in good condition but not drivable since it had been sitting for a while..."Ran when parked" like most old jeeps. It was

being sold by the widow of its last owner. She was planning on moving to another town and needed to get rid of the jeep. Asking price was \$8,000 but I got it for \$4,500 cash. By the time I went to register it a few months later, the lady I bought it from had moved with no forwarding address, which caused an issue with DMV when I needed to correct the way she had signed the title as "for (dead spouse's name)". It all worked out eventually and I was able to display both ambjeeps at the 2016 MVPA convention in Pleasanton.

# A Tribute to Jerry Mambretti from his son

A week ago, my sister Alison and I lost our Dad. COVID-19 stole his lungs, leaving no room for oxygen. He put up a good fight for several days on a biPAP machine, but ultimately succumbed to the deadly virus.

My Dad was first and foremost, a Marine. He served from 1962 until 1971, but like all Marines, he never stopped being one. His service included two combat tours in Vietnam, including being among the very first troops deployed as a "combat" mission, rather than as "advisors." For a time, he was also a member of the Pistol and Rifle team, due to his shooting accuracy.

He was probably best known for his work on cars. Some of my earliest memories of my Dad are him mixing resin to preform body repairs on a '57 Corvette that had a bit of a reputation in the Santa Cruz area. It was stupid fast, and he gave his buddies many white-knuckled rides. He owned many classics over the years- (I hope I have this right) thirteen 55's, six 56's and four 57 Chevrolets. The longest tenure was a sky blue '55 Chevy that EVERYONE knew about. Later, he shifted away from street machines, and began restoring military vehicles. He had several- A HMMWV, a Mighty Mite, MUTT's, and several others were part of the collection at one time or another.

Aside from his personal rides, my Dad also made a living by working on cars. As modern cars transitioned from carburetors to fuel injection, and added things like computerized command control and electronic control units, my Dad quickly adapted to the new technology. He was a widely known expert, and regularly fielded calls from other mechanics throughout the country who needed help solving drivability issues.

He was a helpful guy. If you were a neighbor or a friend, he'd go out of his way to help you out with whatever you needed (even offering up his son for free labor from time to time). He believed in community, and would help wherever and however he could. Most recently, he was working to secure federal funding to restore a historic irrigation ditch that feeds several properties surrounding his, ensuring water rights for him and his neighbors.



If you never met him, I promise you'd have liked him. He had a course exterior, and could be extremely intimidating, but it was all bullshit. He was funny, charming, and just plain cool. He had strong opinions, and was never afraid to voice them, but he'd always leave room for yours.

He was a healthy 76 year old. He took care of himself, and was hardly ever ill. That's the shock of this whole experience. We all thought we had more time. Lots more time. I'm having a bit of difficulty grasping the fact that I'm out of time. I had things to say to him. I had experiences to share with him.

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# From Robin and Carol Bartel

I got my first military vehicle, a 1943 MBT trailer, in 1990. By the mid 1990's I got hired by a local sheet metal shop, and have been there ever since. My restoration projects quickly added up, and I found that I could make just about anything that I needed at work in my free time. Made the seat riser for my WC-62 Dodge truck since it was missing. Used a rusted out relic for a pattern and it came out pretty nice. Soon after I started working on an MZ-2 USMC radio jeep and learned that the antenna loading coil, back seat, and radio boxes were not obtainable. Mark Tombleson was gracious enough to allow me to take a day and measure the boxes in his Jeep, so production began. Oh, my Jeep took 2nd place in the 2012 MVPA convention for factory class!

About this time I bought a nice Converto Airborne Dump trailer off of an ad on Craigslist. Nice enough trailer, but as usual on these; no tail gate. I knew where a complete trailer was on a farm 40 miles away so I knocked on the door and got permission to measure whatever I needed. I've made about 30 tail gates now.

During the Jeep restoration, my mechanic asked if I could make him a WW2 style pioneer rack for one of his trucks. I said that I could, and as of this writing, I've made at least 40 of them for other restorers.

Other projects have included a battery box for an International M2-4, K-38 Cable Splicers Trailer inner tool dividers, and half-track radio speaker brackets. One of the most challenging projects was the spark plug enclosure for the MZ-2 and CJV-35 radio jeeps. (photo to follow) My only limitations are to what tools we have in the shop. I have no way to make, for example, round fenders.






Howdy MV'ers,

This month, work continues on the halftrack project. Last month I shared the work I was doing by cutting off all the extra pieces that were welded on the truck. This month I finished cutting off the extra stuff and am now beginning to grind off the excess welds that were left after using the cutting wheel. I can already see, I'm going to go thru quite a few grinding disks. I also ordered an impact screwdriver bit to try on the armored bolts. I'm having a devil of a time getting them to not spin when I'm trying to get the nuts off. I'm hoping this tool will do the trick. I'll update on this next month.

Armondo Epifany brought over his HET for some repairs. Armondo brought the HET to Eagle Field last June but had motor troubles along the way. Apparently an injector collapsed causing the truck to lose power. He had a mechanic in Los Banos work on it but wanted to look into a couple other items. He brought the HET over to the shop and we dug into it. The HET also has a Detroit Diesel 8V92TA similar to the HEMTT but a bit newer. The engine isn't as easy to get to as it is in the HEMTT but we were still able to work on it. There are airbox drains with check valves on each side of the block. These valves seem to be the problem and are not closing correctly. When they don't close correctly, the motor will continue to spit oil out the valve and thru the slobber tubes causing excessive oil usage. Armondo got the check valves out and ordered 2 new replacements. We will also orient them pointing down instead of sideways to insure the check valve closes properly.

Notice the box in the back of the truck? This is a collapsible shelter. It raises up and makes quite the camping condo. He even put down flooring inside along with a couch/foldaway bed. This shelter also has lighting, heat and A/C. Talk about Glamping. Sure beats sleeping on the dirt.

Be on the lookout at camp Plymouth for this monster. It'll be hard to miss. This is also a reminder that I will be the POC for the M151 Mutt showcase.

# Stuff to do at Camp Plymouth by Nancy Porter

Of course, Camp Plymouth is the biggest thing to do in Amador County at the end of April. But if you want to get out and take a drive, there are quite a few other places to explore.

We will have our annual Poker Rally Thursday morning. Here are some other places you can explore on your own. There are more fun locations, but this article focuses on places that are open when we are at Camp Plymouth this April.

- Wineries. The area is known as Shenandoah Valley and home to OVER 40! extraordinary wineries, many with fantastic views. Most wineries are open Thursday through Sunday. There should be some winery maps in the office at the 49'er or you can, of course, find a map online.
- **Amador Flower Farm:** 22001 Shenandoah School Road, Plymouth. 9 am to 4 pm. We've driven by here on past poker rallies. This Plymouth location is famous for having 800 varieties of daylilies, including many vintage varieties. And, if you or your passengers like plants, Karmere Winery nearby has a very fun garden with sculpted evergreens.
- Amador City: There's a nice museum here that's open on Friday, Saturday and Sunday from noon to 4. I've heard great reviews from members about the restaurants and antique stores here, too.
- Sutter Creek: Wine tasting, great restaurants, a candy shop, and a variety of stores are clustered on Main Street in this picturesque town. We highly recommend the pizza parlor and Canava's Pub & Grub for food.
- **Fiddletown**: The town is a California Historical Landmark and on the Register of Historic Places. Wander past the historic buildings and stop in the candy store for lunch, a bottle of water or homemade Celtic candies.
- **Volcano:** Wander through this small down and grab some lunch. It's close to Black Chasm Cavern and Chaw/See (see below), so combining the historic sites with a lunch stop can be a great getaway.
- **Black Chasm Cavern:** We visited this historic spot during our Fall meet. It's well worth a visit for a tour. There are many stairs leading down into and through the limestone cavern. A short walk outside can take you to a spot to see the remnants of hydraulic mining of the 1800's.
- Chaw/Se Indian Grinding Rock State Park: This is close to Black Chasm Cavern, Volcano and Pine Grove and has native buildings (like a reconstructed round house) in addition to buildings restored from the property's history as a ranch. There is an \$8 parking fee. The park is open from 10 4.
- **Downtown Jackson:** Main Street has restaurants and a variety of specialty stores, including antiques, clothing, housewares and a Victorian shop. The area before you get into Jackson (Martell) is the place to go if you're looking for Walmart, Safeway and some other box stores.
- **Kennedy Gold Mine:** This old gold mine is in Jackson and marked by the tall head frames that still remain. Opened in 1860 and closed in 1942, over \$34 million in gold was pulled out of this mine. Tours are available on the weekend.
- Casinos: Jackson Rancheria and Harrah's in Ione have your usual casino games and a few restaurants.

**Helwig Winery:** On Shenandoah Road in Plymouth has an ampitheater with name bands providing concerts. The 2022 schedule hasn't been released. I'm not sure when the concerts will start by the end of April. Check their website for details. Placerville's historic Main Street is about 40 minutes north of Camp Plymouth. Among the must-see highlights is Placerville Hard-

ware. It's the longest continually operating hardware store west of the Mississippi (over 100 years) and has been featured on the History Channel. This is a place that's packed with hardware, housewares, yard items, gifts and souvenirs. We buy the heavy rope for our vehicles there in the back. The rope is pulled down off rolls near the ceiling and measured by brass markers on the floor as done for a century or more. Another unique historic business is Placerville News with its original hardwood floors and wide selection of magazines and books about California history and the Gold Rush. (My Gold Rush book is even for sale there!) The location of the original hanging tree in Hangtown is now the site of a very good restaurant, Placerville Public House.

## Wright Museum of World War II by Chris Hughes

As mentioned in a previous article, my dad and I spent a week this past September touring around Massachusetts and New Hampshire as part of our annual "Father-Son Museum Trip". While spending a day in New Hampshire, we discovered a museum that packed a big surprise in a small package, the Wright Museum of World War II.

Located in idyllic town of Wolfeboro, NH the Wright Museum of World War II, is approximately one hour northwest of Portsmouth, NH and two hours northwest of Boston. The museum was established by the late David Wright. Mr. Wright was the son of a World War II veteran while being a USMC Korean War veteran himself. The museum was originally set up in 1983 as a mobile exhibition. In 1992, Mr. Wright purchased a property in Wolfeboro and proceeded to build a permanent museum. The museum as it currently stands was officially opened in July 1994.

The 30,000 square foot museum is the home of over 14,000 artifacts relating to World War II. The museum combines the artifacts in various galleries covering the Home Front and the battlefield. The museum starts in the Visitor Lobby where the admissions/information booth is located. To the right of the booth the walls are decorated with the flags



of the Allied nations and various Saturday Evening Post covers done by Norman Rockwell. Continuing further to the right, there's a small theater that plays various films related to the museum and World War II.

Upon exiting the theater, visitors enter the large Home Front Gallery. The Home Front Gallery consists of numerous exhibits about life in the United States both pre-war and during the war. Various artifacts such as newspapers, letters, children's toys, and other items are displayed on the walls and in glass cases. In addition, there are various life size dioramas including a soda foun-

tain, a "typical" family living room, and a garage to name a few. A section of the old Wolfeboro Falls Post Office is also on display.

From the Home Front Gallery, visitors enter the Time Tunnel. The Time Tunnel consists of seven small galleries covering from 1939 thru 1945. Life Magazine covers are posted around the perimeter of each gallery. Additional artifacts including signs, newspapers, and even part of a crashed torpedo bomber are displayed in the galleries. The artifacts are all organized by the year in which they were created or their particular event occurred. Hanging in each room is a sign that lists the prices of major consumer goods for each year. For example, in 1939 the average yearly income was \$1,725.00. By 1945, it had risen to \$2,390.00. Gasoline in 1939 was \$.10 a gallon; in 1945, \$.15.







After the Time Tunnel is the Military Gallery. The Military Gallery displays many of the vehicles owned and operated by the museum. During our visit, we saw 3 Harley-Davidson motorcycles of various types, a 1942 GPW, a Dodge Command Car, a M16 Multiple Gun Motor Carriage, a M2 Half-track, a M3A1 Stuart, and a T26E3 Pershing. The Pershing is an extremely important example of this type of tank as it is one of three that were used to capture the Ludendorff Bridge, aka "the Remagen Bridge" over the Rhine River in March 1945. The museum has several other military vehicles including a M20 Armored Utility Vehicle and M4A1 (76)HVSS Sherman. The Military Gallery is further decorated with various infantry equipment, photos, maps, and written descriptions of various battles.

The Military Gallery is continued further upstairs on the mezzanine level. Here visitors will find various uniforms, small arms, and personnel equipment. A nice selection of large-scale ship models is prominently displayed as well. The mezzanine provides a nice overlook of the downstairs Military Gallery and allows for excellent overhead views of the vehicles. To round out the Military Gallery, an artillery liaison aircraft is displayed, hanging from the ceiling

A gift shop is located at the end of the galleries, in the visitor lobby. The shop has the usual selection of shirts, books, etc. that are related to the museum.

The Wright Military Museum of World War II was an extremely pleasant surprise for my dad and I. It was not part of our original plans for our trip, but once we found out about it, we were quite happy that we made to trek to see it. The museum is extremely well put together with a very friendly and knowledgeable staff. The only drawback in my mind is its location. However, if you're in the Boston area and want to add another military history type destination, then the Wright Military Museum of World War
