Happy New Years to all MVCC Members. I hope all is well!


One day back in June I was on FB market place and happened to see a little K38 Military trailer marked as yard art for a very reasonable price. 


Season's Greetings, Happy New Year and Keep 'Em Rollin',

Spruce Goose and the Evergreen Museum By MVCC member Eirk Terberg

When Mary and I travel, we try to take our time and make very few day to day plans. There was no long trip in 2020 because everything was closed but we were invited to a wedding in Rhode Island in August 2021 so that became the focus of our trip. Everything else was up in the air. With the motorhome loaded and the Wrangler attached, off we went at the beginning of July. Now the quickest

way to the east coast from So Cal is to just head east but that is much too simple, especially when there are good friends to visit in the Pacific Northwest. We headed north. The last time we went through Oregon, we skipped visiting the Spruce Goose. This time we stopped at the Evergreen Museum in McMinnville, Oregon. The Spruce Goose is big enough that I couldn't get it all into one photo. Big enough that there is an F-100 Super Sabre, an FW-190, an ME-262, an F-7 Corsair, an F-105 Thunderchief, an F-86 Sabrejet and several other planes all tucked under the wings and around the fuselage. There a many more military and non-military aircraft including a helicopter with bullet holes acquired in Vietnam. There is a large section devoted to aerospace with a model of the Lunar Landing Module, a model of the Lunar Rover and some interactive displays. They even have an example of a Titan II rocket, which was used in the Gemini program. The museum also has an SR-71 Blackbird. Very cool.



For those of you who don't know about the Spruce Goose, it is the largest wooden airplane with a wingspan of more than 300 feet that only flew one time across Los Angeles Harbor on November 2, 1947. It is the only Hughes H-4 Hercules ever built. A strategic prototype airlift flying boat, Hughes Aircraft designed it as a trans-Atlantic flight transport but it was not finished in time to be used in WW II. Powered by eight Pratt & Whitney 3000 hp engines it weighs 250,000 pounds empty and was designed to carry 150,000 pounds. One interesting feature is an elevator which will lift a crew member up through the top of the fuselage so he has a better view while taxiing.

If you are ever traveling through Oregon, schedule a visit. You can read about how it took 138 days to transport the plane from Long Beach to McMinnville and how they designed and built building specifically for the Spruce Goose. Happy travels!

Howdy MVers,

Tis the season for working on your MVs indoors. The wet weather has given me the nudge I needed to re-start the halftrack project. If you recall, the halftrack I found was repurposed into a weed abatement spray rig. last year I cut off a ton of the rigging and removed the spray tank but hadn't got to the tougher pieces. The previous owner welded a ton of rigging onto the halftrack to handle the spray arms etc. Unfortunately, they used pieces of the halftrack itself and cut them to make the rigging pieces. Using a cut-off wheel, I carefully cut the welds to release the pieces.

Lucky for me the person who welded on the truck wasn't that great of a welder. The penetration was not too deep so I could grind a bit then knock off the piece with minimal grinding into the halftrack.

I spent the good portion of a day cutting and grinding off all kinds of weird parts, pieces and rigging. My pile of "cutoffs" grew pretty quickly. I heard that armored plate can break when welded. I have a piece "broken" where they tried to weld the gas can bracket in a different position on the halftrack. pretty interesting to say the least. Here is my current "cuttoff" pile. As you can see, unfortunately many of the armor pieces of the truck were cut up.

I'll be working on and off the halftrack this winter so if anyone is interested in helping me continue the process of disassembling this halftrack, don't hesitate to volunteer. Food and adult beverages are included.
