

Happy New Year MVCC Members!

Tiss the NEW Season. What am I looking forward to in the new year you ask? As if you or anyone would have had to ask, because this time every year I look forward to the MVCC Camp Plymouth Military Vehicle Show and Swap Meet in good ole Plymouth California USA.

Important news for MVCC members starting January 1st. Due to the newsletter postage going up from \$.70 cents (2016) to \$.84 cents (2022), AND, due to the printing of the newsletter going up from \$1.50(2016) each to starting January 1st going to \$2.85 cents each the cost of **mailed membership** will go up to keep up with the costs. Not many know this, but the MVCC has been losing money on mailed memberships for a while due to the pandemic and inflation. Check out the following:

A newsletter stamp is **\$.84** cents each – printing is **\$2.85** each – costing the club **\$44.20** a year. A MVCC member is paying **\$40** a year for the mailed membership which means your club was losing **\$4.20** a mailed membership a year. Multiply that by **240 mailed memberships** and you see the issue. So, as of January 1st memberships will go up to keep the MVCC at least breaking even.

The new mailed membership is now \$50 a year and \$135 for 3 years. All of this is to help the MVCC break even on mailed memberships. The above does **not** affect **online memberships**, it will stay at \$30 a year.

December Newsletter: For those that didn't notice, the December online newsletter had 2 pages more than the mailed version. The mailed version can't be more than 28 pages due to pricing/expense, meaning the more pages you add the more it costs to print. We don't have that issue with online newsletters, meaning you can add as many pages as you want it won't cost any more. Also, online goes out on the 1st of every month, the mailed version is up to the postal service. I just want to make sure everyone knows the specifics about the newsletter. If you have any questions please feel free to shoot me an email.






Hello North Bay West and beyond,

Merry Christmas and Happy New year to everyone. I hope you are all doing well and having fun with your MVs. I was going to participate in the annual Woodland CA holiday parade but it was cancelled because of the rain. It is a bummer because I was supposed to carry some Vets in my MV but given that we need this rain so badly, I can't complain too much. I've been soaking the bolts on the leaky lift cylinder on the HEMTT with PB blaster in preparation for removal. I may tackle that next month.

Although not MV related, I sent some time working on my 1966 Cushman Lobster. My plan is to give it a coat of O.D. green paint so it fits in better with the rest of the fleet. I may have that done by camp Plymouth this April. A few months ago, I wrote about getting it running and stopping so now that the major stuff was fixed, it was time to tackle the smaller items. The voltage regulator was shot and I did not have working lights or horn.

I tackled the voltage regulator first. I obtained a new one off of Amazon for about \$30.00. The old one was bad and was even hanging down since the mounting pads had rotted out. (regulator old photo)

The new one was an exact match.(regulator new photo) It as a challenge installing the new one since I couldn't get my fingers in between the regulator and the mounting plate. Some needle nose pliers and patience and I got it installed. I had to move the coil out of the way and mounted it a bit higher so that it didn't rest on the voltage regulator. <regulator installed.jpg>


Now on to the lights. I used my voltage meter and determined the switch was bad. I could have bought a new switch but thought it would be a fun challenge to try and fix the original one. (switch to fix.jpg)

I carefully bent the side tabs open with needle nose pliers and was able to open up the switch. (switch apart.jpg)

It was just badly corroded inside so I cleaned the internals with a wire brush and reassembled the switch. The switch was now working properly so I reinstalled it and BINGO, I had lights. I was surprised and pleasantly pleased that the bulbs were still good. It puts off quite a bit of light. The tail light even works! It'll be fun to tool around Camp Plymouth at night on this thing.

The final project for the day was the horn. Again, using my voltage meter, I pinned out the horn and figured out the horn button was the issue. (horn button before.jpg)

I removed the button and carefully disassembled it. This a bit tricky since the metal housing was bent around the internals rather than using conventional hardware. I was able to open up the button assembly and it was very rusty and corroded inside. Like the light switch, it was a pretty simple device. the two metal tabs need to make contact for the circuit to close.

RV & Travel Trailer Rental Update for Camp Plymouth By John Neuenburg

In the December newsletter we talked about some options for renting RVs or travel trailers for those who would like to stay in the 49er Village. To summarize, it was renting one, loading it, and driving or towing it to the event, or having a travel trailer delivered by the owner to your campsite, setting it up, and picking it up after the event. For both options you have the choice of using a commercial rental company, one of the RV rental broker websites who help individuals rent their units, or finding a private owner via websites like Facebook Marketplace, Craigslist, or NextDoor.

I just rented a trailer from Advantage Caravans in Sacramento. A 26-footer built in 2017. Regular price \$100 per day but with the 20% discount we negotiated for Camp Plymouth participants, \$80 per day. We usually stay five nights, so the trailer will cost us \$400 for rental fee, credit card processing fee of about \$22, a delivery/setup/pickup fee of \$150, hygiene supply fee of \$17, and tax about \$46. Total will be about \$635. Then I add the RV site rental which will be around \$380 including tax. Net approx. \$1,015. That is \$203 per day. The bigger cabins are \$242 or \$260 plus tax in 2023. The problem with the 49er is not enough cabins for our demand. With a trailer we get to stay more or less where we want in the 49er, and we will have more space for sales tables and displays. The best thing about this is we can bring our MVs and sales goods. It is a MV show and swap meet after all! This is why I talked them into giving a discount. It's good for our event if more military stuff shows up. By the way, I get no compensation for plugging this vendor.

As for other terms, I paid \$100 with the reservation and the balance plus a \$500 security deposit is due April 17. The deposit is returned 7 days after our event pending no issues with the trailer. The interesting thing is there is no broker fee or insurance charge, which is what the broker sites add.

We have done this twice with Advantage with no trouble and excellent service including the driver showing up close to checkout time on Sunday. I give these details to help others as they consider their options. Advantage is at www.advantagervrentals.com. Owner Alex is at 916-832-8824.




My 1943 Dodge WC-52 by Robin & Carol Cartel

My first military vehicle, back in the early 1990's, was a 1943 Dodge WC-52 Weapons Carrier that I drove around town every chance that I got. One such day I visited a local flea market where one of the old guys I usually bought stuff from saw my truck and proceeded to tell me that there was another one "just like it" about 30 miles away sitting next to a barn. So, after getting some "basic" directions, I went home and got my everyday car and went on a road trip. Sure enough, his directions brought me to a logging company, and in the tall weeds next to the barn was what appeared to maybe be something military, but from the road I wasn't sure. So, I walked around the place and knocked on a few doors but couldn't find anybody. So, not to waste a trip I made my way through the weeds and stomped them down around the truck. Sure enough, there was a very civilianized WC-62 sitting there!

Now armed with more ambition to locate anyone who could tell me who the owner was, I saw a house about 1/4 mile away and thought I'd start there. The old gentleman who answered my knock was the owner! After the usual pleasantries were out of the way, I asked him about the truck. He asked me if I liked it, and of course I said "yes". He then told me that I could just have it to get it off his property. He hadn't used it since 1968 and had no plans to use it in the future. Well, that just made my day! I told him that I would be back with a trailer as soon as I could find one to borrow. Luckily my boss had just the right truck and trailer and was willing to let me use it.

So now that WC-62 got to sit at my Dad's house for the next 16 years, out in the back field. In the meantime, I started gathering parts for my new project. Even located the correct T-223 engine for it. Eventually in 2012 I had room at my place to get started on it. The logging company had converted it into a maintenance truck to work on their equipment. The hard top that you can see in the pictures was held on by 144 rivets and some welds. Once that was removed things started moving along pretty well. I was surprised to find that the original unit markings were very visible. The truck was marked to the 90th Division, 359th Infantry, Company I, and Anti-tank 15 on the right end of the bumper. The tips of the bumpers and the rear corners of the bed were painted white, an indication of being used in black-out conditions in England. It was also drilled for a ring mount for a machine gun. I am convinced that this is one of the rare trucks that actually saw combat and returned to the US after the War was over. After about 2 years of working on it, I considered it restored. Maybe someday I will drive it.





That takes a lot of boot leather! Driving MVs is authorized but the challenge in the 49er Village is lack of parking for cars and trucks. Even at the fairgrounds tent village and display area around the arena there is minimal if any parking unless in a rented site. The main parking lot is **Golf Cart Renting Details for the Spring 2023 Camp Plymouth**

close, but how nice it would be to be able to have a small vehicle in your camp for driving around and pulling over to inspect sales goods or socialize without blocking the fire lanes. Those with military jeeps can usually find a camper OK with the jeep being parked at his site for a bit. Ditto golf carts. How nice it would be to shop in a four passenger cart with a flip down flatbed!

The MVCC set up a golf cart rental program. This is not a profit center for the club. We will not rent them from the vendor, you will directly. We do not get a commission. We contacted a handful of companies and found the best deal for our participants.

Gipson Golf Carts at nearby Rancho Murieta is our approved vendor. They will deliver them to a cart corral to be arranged and pick them up. The rate for a four-passenger flip cart for four days will be \$55 per day. For fewer days, \$60. No delivery fee. We will publish the rate for a six-passenger cart next month or sooner on our website. You can contact Zach starting now at 916-806-0920 and say you will be a participant at the Camp Plymouth event April 19 to 23. They will do the rental agreement via email or snail mail.

We would like to know soon how popular this will be so we can tell Zach and he will hopefully have enough carts available. Please let member John Neuenburg know if you plan to rent one. Email in_garage@hotmail.com or 415-847-2801 and he will feed Zach the numbers. They are not planning to bring carts that are not pre-rented.


Greetings to all MVCC Members,

49er Village RV Resort and Amador County Fairgrounds

BASIC TRAINING – as of 12/2/2022



This is the largest annual event for historic ex-military vehicles (MVs) in the Western United States. The Plymouth venue is the fifth for the Spring meet that started in the late 1970s, promoted by the Military Vehicle Collectors of California, a non-profit corporation.

This venue has two sides, separated by a fence, with a campground in each. The show and swap meet are on both sides:

49er Village RV Resort is at 18265 Highway 49, Plymouth, CA 95669. Rental cabins, RV camping and vendor sites.

Amador County Fairgrounds is adjacent to the 49er, our gate is approximately at 18343 Empire Street. Tent camping village, display arena, visitor and trailer parking.

CAMPING

- 1.Event is Wednesday, April 19 to Sunday April 23 but Sunday is a pull-out day, not a show day.
- 2.Our group discounted rates at the 49er are valid 3 days before and 3 days after the event on a space available basis.
3. No tent camping is allowed at the 49er per their policy - cabins and RV camping only.
- 4.49er RV sites are full hookup and come with paved parking pads generally 40-50 feet long, some up to 70 feet long. Pad width 12 to 15 or more feet. There is lawn next to it and usually a large shade tree.
- 5.Pull through sites are limited and are at the south end only.
- 6.Tent or truck camping is available at the Fairgrounds - no RVs unless there is no space at the 49er.
- 7.Fairgrounds sites are mostly dry with a limited number of sites with water and power available. Few have shade.
- 8.All reservations for cabins, and sites will be coordinated and reserved through the MVCC Camp Mistress (Jo-Ann Lesser) at mvcccampmistress@yahoo.com. A camping reservation form will be available elsewhere.
- 9.4-night minimum reservation at the 49er (may be waived by 49er management).
- 10.No minimum reservation for tent camping at the Fairgrounds.
- 11.For 49er sites and cabins in our discounted block that Jo-Ann assigns, she gives the camper list to the 49er office and instructs campers to contact the office to pay for their reservation.
- 12..Jo-Ann also assigns sites at the Fairgrounds. Payment in full for those must be made payable to“MVCC” at the time of reservation. Enclose payment when sending the form to Jo-Ann.
- 13.Campfires are permitted in above-ground fire pits at the 49er and at the Fairgrounds. Pits and wood are available through the 49er office.
- 14.The 49er and the Fairgrounds are pet friendly. Dogs must be kept on a leash in public areas

DRIVING, ADMISSION, DAY USE, PARKING, REGISTRATION

- 15.No admission fee for this event. No parking fee. No vendor fee but sellers must rent a campsite or cabin.
- 16.No MV registration fee or pre-registration.
- 17.Visitor parking and trailer storage is free at the Fairgrounds. Visitor parking in the 49er Village is extremely limited, do not expect to find it. Our large parking lot is just inside the Empire Street entrance, near the tent camping village and display arena. To visit the 49er by foot from the Fairgrounds, walk out to Empire Street and along the shoulder to the 49er main entrance.
- 18.Do not forget to check out the 49er for more MVs and vendors!
- 19.Driving on roads at both sides of the event is authorized. Five mile per hour maximum in campgrounds. No steel grousers or worn tracks that will scrape pavement. All roads in the 49er are paved.
- 20.Vehicle insurance is required per California DMV requirements.
- 21.Driving without a driver’s license is not allowed at the event.
- 22.No parking along roads in the 49er. Park in YOUR campsite only.
- 23.No parking in vacant campsites because they will not be vacant for long.
- 24.No vehicle parking on lawn areas at the 49er due to the presence of underground sprinkler pipes.
- 25.Illegally parked vehicles may be towed.
- 26.Roads and campsites at the Fairgrounds must not be blocked by parked vehicles.
- 27.NO PARKING on Empire Street between our Fairgrounds gate and the 49er entrance. This will be used by golf carts and pedestrians.

SWAP MEET and DISPLAYS

- 28.Swap meet is event-wide at 49er and Fairgrounds campsites. Anyone may put out sales goods.
- 29.No vendor fee but all sellers must rent a campsite.
- 30.Pop up tents are allowed in the 49er but camping in them is not, per 49er regulations. Rules say no tent pins.
- 31.Military-themed displays are encouraged at campsites in both campgrounds.
- 32.Displays deemed by the MVCC Board to be excessively controversial or disruptive might be prohibited. These can include the vertical display of SS or Gestapo uniforms, including wearing them, and Nazi flags. However, these collectible items may be offered for sale if displayed flat on tables or the ground. Further, display of contemporary manufactured items (shirts, flags, posters, etc.) with symbols and/or verbiage that are commonly deemed offensive is not allowed. Common sense and due regard for the feelings and experiences of others is expected of all event attendees.

33. Other than the exclusion mentioned above, the wearing of obsolete military uniforms and clothing is welcome.
34. Special Displays can be accommodated free of charge at the Fairgrounds, at designated places, if space is available. Please ask our camping coordinator Jo-Ann about that.
35. Those commuting from hotel or home in a MV can have a free display/parking spot at the Fairgrounds, near the tent camping village or display arena, if space is available.
36. A normal campsite rental fee is required if sleeping or vending in a display.

THEMED VEHICLE SHOWCASES

37. As of 12/1/2022 there are three showcases planned for Friday April 21: World War Two Jeeps, Military Dodges, and Military Motorcycles, Scooters, and Bicycles. The first two will be at the practice rodeo arena by the Fairgrounds tent village and parking lot. The third will be at a location at the 49er Village TBA. See an upcoming Activities Schedule for location.
38. All MVs are welcome, restored or not, modified ones are OK, any country of former military service.
39. Typically coordinator for each showcase will ask participants for owner's name and vehicle information for a follow-up newsletter and/or magazine article.
40. Typically, there is no formal MV judging but possibly People's Choice Contests.
41. Normally the Point of Contact for each showcase will get the owner's name and vehicle information for after-event newsletter and/or national magazine articles about the show.

FIREARMS, PYROTECHNICS, EXPLOSIVES, ORDNANCE

42. Firearms may be displayed if their presence does not violate Federal, State, or local laws. Firearms may not be offered for sale, sold, or traded at Camp Plymouth. Firearm parts and fake, dummy, dawat, demilled, airsoft, and similar non-guns and ordnance may be offered for sale if it does not violate Federal, State, or local laws.
42. Live ammunition, pyrotechnics, explosive devices, and the discharge of blanks or gas guns are not permitted at Camp Plymouth, except if authorized by the MVCC Board for a special activity.

1. 44. EVENT MERCHANDISE, RAFFLE, MEETINGS, OFF-SITE EXCURSIONS

45. The Military Vehicle Collectors of California (MVCC) is the promoter and normally will have an event headquarters and merchandise sales tent in operation Thursday through Saturday. Souvenir T-shirts and other merchandise will be available for sale and MVCC memberships can be purchased or renewed.
46. A raffle and social event will occur on Friday night in the 49er Recreation Room near the store and pool. It will be open to all attendees. Prize donations will be received at the Event Headquarters tent but if that changes this document will be edited. Please enclose item description and donor name so the donor is given credit for supporting Camp Plymouth.
47. Raffle proceeds go to the MVCC, to support this and future events and activities.
48. A MVCC Board meeting and a General Membership Meeting will be held at locations TBA on the Activities Schedule posted elsewhere. All are welcome to the Membership Meeting.
49. Information about a military vehicle road run will appear on the Activities Schedule
50. Ditto for women's events.

GOLF CART RENTALS

51. As of 12/1/2022, a golf cart rental program is tentative. If this happens, the MVCC will publicize a preferred vendor, rates, and details on the event page on www.MVCCNews.net.

RV RENTAL OPTIONS

52. Renting a RV or travel trailer is a way to stay at the 49er Village. There are commercial rental vendors and private owners who will deliver, set up, and pick up an RV or trailer. The websites www.RVShare.com and www.Outdoorsy.com are brokers for private owners and these can be searched by area, such as near Plymouth, and if the owner will deliver and pick up.
53. Renting a travel trailer and having it delivered allows bringing a MV or load of sales items. Unlike renting a cabin, using a RV site means it is possible to camp in other areas of the 49er.
54. Advantage Caravans in Sacramento is offering a 20% discount on their daily rental rate to Camp Plymouth attendees. See www.AdvantageRVRentals.com
55. More on this may be found elsewhere on this website.

AMENITIES

56. Amenities at the 49er include swimming pool, spa, volleyball, shuffleboard, horseshoes, billiards, kid's playground, rec hall with kitchen, amphitheater, terrace, café, restrooms with showers, laundry, store, propane, firewood, very limited temporary parking.
57. Amenities at the Fairgrounds include restroom with showers, parking lot, limited water and power.
58. Hotels, restaurants, grocery store, antique stores, hardware store, Indian Casino, wineries, historic Gold Rush towns and sites and other attractions are nearby. The grocery store/deli is an easy walk.
59. Amador County is home for nearly 40 wineries. Those in the Shenandoah Valley Viticultural Area are just outside of Plymouth.

MY BMW75 by Stefan and Becky Fisher

I have been a motorcycle enthusiast ever since I could ride a bicycle. I got my first motorcycle when I was in high school and have been riding ever since. I had a few dirt bikes then started on street bikes.

I had always heard of BMWs and how reliable they were, so I bought one and started restoring it. It took a lot of work but I managed to get it going. I rode it for quite a while and started noticing many BMWs had sidecars which I thought was interesting, so I bought my first sidecar, hooked it up and began a life time of collecting and restoring BMW motorcycles and sidecars from the 50's and 60's.

I learned that BMW made a motorcycle/sidecar combination for the military during World War 2 which had many features and made this unit appealing. After a few years I finally got the courage to locate one and rebuild it. This process took several years and I got one off of eBay.

The motorcycle arrived by truck freight, and I was jazzed! It had most of the right parts and required a paint job in addition to mechanical work. Quite a bit of work was in store for me but I was prepared to do it.

Within hours of getting it home I began the process of documenting with notes and photographs for rebuilding because I knew it would take a long time. My memory alone wouldn't work. Then I began disassembling and boxing parts up, organizing it for reassembly. I then had a huge pile of boxes to deal with.

Time had passed and all was going good with it going back together when I ran into an old work partner, Angus Smith, and showed him my collection of parts, some finished and most still needing work. As many of you know Angus is a very enthusiastic member of the MVCC. He spoke to me of the club and talked me into joining which gave me the motivation to finish up the bike and bring it to Camp Delta. At the time I did not realize it but I was entering the world of historical military vehicles.



In the late 1930's the German military contracted with both BMW and Zündapp to produce a heavy motorcycle to facilitate the quick and efficient deployment of troops in the field. This is a factory stock version of the motorcycle as produced by BMW from 1939 thru 1945.

This particular motorcycle was built in 1943 and has all matching serial numbers on the engine, motorcycle frame and sidecar frame. It has a 750cc boxer motor developing 26 horsepower. The transmission is a 4 speed with 4 forward gears and I gear for reverse. A hi-lo feature will keep pace with infantry troops and highway traffic. The power-driven sidecar with locking differential provides two-wheel drive as needed. It was the first motorcycle designed with hydraulic brakes to the sidecar and the rear motorcycle wheel. All wheels are interchangeable and the tires are the same as the Kubelwagen. It has automatic centrifugal advance, trailer towing capability and telescopic forks. The tubular component frame facilitates ease of repair in the field. It is capable of climbing 40% incline and can ford water up to 14" deep. The complete weight of the motorcycle with sidecar and fluids is 924 lbs and has a maximum speed of 60 mph with a cruising speed of 50mph.

It was great to learn all the features of this bike but I felt it needed something more. I wanted to find any divisional markings on the bike, so as I was prepping for painting I hand sanded the fenders, fuel tank and sidecar body to see what I would expose. I found nothing. Each time the color changed I only found another shade of green, gray, white etc. The bike had been repainted no less than 5 times.

BMW has a birth certificate program. If you send them the details, numbers, etc. of your bike they will send back a document stating where it went and what features it had when it left the factory. Well, I did that and found out that the factory was bombed out in 1944 causing BMW to lose most records from that time. Since the origin is unknown, an internet search provided markings for the bike to represent a late war Army unit from a heavy motorcycle machinegun company of the 24th Panzer Division.

Stop by and see it for yourself this spring at Camp Plymouth's motorcycle, scooter and bicycle showcase.



