Convoying Basics

We often use the term “convoy.” This word can be a noun because it’s a thing, or a verb, like “to convoy to Camp Delta.” Obviously it means to drive as a coordinated group, like a military unit does. The nice thing about being with others is it makes a long, slow drive more enjoyable. Tire kicking is fun during rest stops, there are attractive trucks and jeeps to look at, a vehicle problem is more likely to be fixed fast, and only the guy in the back gets rear-ended! But this brings up a negative thing about convoys – overly close spacing. Anybody who has been on a freeway or fast multi-lane road at 45 mph around fast-movers going 70 should know what I’m talking about. What happens when your group is bunched up admiring the other guy’s bumper markings, and then a speeding car in the fast lane wants to merge through you to an off-ramp? Imagine him cutting in front of you and hauling down on his brakes! Now you know what your minimum following distance should be. Tip: when your buddy drives past a marker, count to eight, maybe ten, before you pass that marker. The police do not like slow traffic and they definitely don’t like closely-spaced slow traffic. Here are a few more tips about driving as a group. Appoint a convoy commander and assistant.

Leader is MV #1 and Assistant is tail-end-Charlie (can be opposite). Have a pre-trip driver briefing.

Commander outlines the plan. Talk about the route – a map for each driver is nice. This can also have a turn By turn list on the other side, which some people find easier to understand. Decide on the cruising speed before the day of the trip because for some, the speed desired by the group will not work for their MV and they needn’t show up. Your MV should be able to exceed the convoy speed by 3-5 mph in order to catch up if necessary, so everybody talk about that during the briefing. Schedule stops for fuel, food, bathroom break, and for wayward MVs to catch up. Publish radio freqs and cell numbers. Decide what happens when someone pulls over. Hand signals for “I’m in trouble” or “I dropped my cell phone while texting (!) and you don’t need to stop too.” If you are the one stopping, wave each person by except the one approaching that you think will be most likely to help you, OR the Assistant in the rear. Consider equipping the assistant with a tow rope or strap. This maneuver is your call and may not be legal, however it is also good to get a disabled vehicle out of a bad place. Leader and assistant should be able to communicate, so test this right away at speed. Lights on so it’s easier to spot MVs in your mirror. Ideally a vehicle with left and right tail lamps including turn signals is in the rear, a safety triangle is a good idea, and it should be a medium to large truck for visibility. Remember that the last vehicle controls lane changes, assuming you have a line of MVs and prefer to minimize civilians in your midst. When a lane change is in order, or to pull onto the road after a halt, the last vehicle starts it, thus blocking any civilians approaching from the rear. Flash lights so everybody knows to move left. So it’s important for everybody to adjust their mirror so they can see this happening. In the briefing, discuss the points along the way where this maneuver is going to happen, if any. This is more important on roads and multi-lane boulevards than on the freeway unless the freeway has a left exit you need to take. So, the last driver really has to know what is coming before it gets there. I have been in some convoys that are too slow, which in a no-passing situation aggravates civilians. I saw a near road-rage incident against a MVer once. Commander needs to watch for an excessive number of cars being held up, either by eye or from reports from the assistant, and then pull the group over to let them by. Use judgment about how many cars this will be. Going overly slow also increases speed-differential problems. Driving less than 45 mph on a level freeway is illegal in California. There is no ideal cruising speed. It depends on the lay of the land, length of segments with no passing allowed, and of course the vehicles involved. On hills, some vehicles will slow down more than others, so keep that in mind when setting the order of march. Slow one in front affects everybody, or if near the rear, he and anybody behind him will get separated and might have to catch up at the next halt. Again, watch the following distances to avoid problems with fast movers and to avoid rear-ending your buddy because you can’t see his lights. Main thing with convoys is to plan ahead, brief the troops, follow the plan, have fun, and arrive safely. If anyone has anything to add, sound off to Dave.
