

Convention Hotel Room Block, Excursions, and Dinners Are Filling Up By John Neuenburg

As of June 6, all of these things are on a pace to sell-out. If you have not purchased your excursion tickets to Wente Vineyards, the USS Hornet Museum, or Fisherman's Wharf to see the sub and Liberty ship and/or take a Bay Cruise, go right now to <u>www.mvpa.org</u> to download the registration form or copy it from Supply Line magazine, and send it in. Or call the MVPA office in Missouri at 800-365-5798. Ditto the Friday dinner before the Auction at the fairgrounds, and the Awards Banquet at the Doubletree Hotel. If you have already registered, just send in a second form to purchase these things.

If you are not a MVPA member but want to attend one of the dinners or tours, either join or find a MVPA member and get onto his form. Dave Ball and I know members. MVPA membership is only \$35 for the E-membership where you receive the nice magazines electronically, or \$50 to get the hard copies.

Book Doubletree hotel rooms via the link on the convention page at <u>www.mvpa.org</u> that takes you to our convention room reservation page. Or call 866-288-3305 and use Group Code MVC to get the \$119.00 rate. As mentioned last month, Tuesday and Wednesday are not available at that rate, so don't ask for those dates or they will say, "No rate available." IT'S TIME TO REGISTER YOUR CONVENTION VEHICLES!

We know from talking to people that many of you have not gotten around to registering your MVs for showing at the MVPA event this August 11-13. This makes the MVPA nervous. If you know you will be bringing a MV to the event, please register it soon. If you are not sure if you will bring more than one, just register one and send another form in later for the second if you want. The more we know early, the better we can plan for what goes where. Now is not early! We hope the people who bring an MV to Tower Park will bring it to the convention.

Reminder that it costs about the same to attend this show as it does to go to Tower Park. The Display Only MV category has no fee. The main difference is the convention requires a personal registration fee of \$30 for a MVPA member or his guest. That's for a three-day name badge pass (plus set up Wednesday). Adding a spouse makes it only \$35 total, and a family with children under 18 is \$40. Elsewhere we'll talk about getting in as a non-MVPA member.

Your vehicle is welcome in any condition. This is not a concours d'Elegance, although some MVs entered into the Restored judging category will be very nice. That's a vehicle that is supposed to look like it was just accepted by the government or its first duty station (unit markings are OK). There is also the Motor Pool category which is the place for something with dents, scratches, and more. There is a \$40 fee for either Judged category. Then we have the For Sale category and these vehicles will be in a special place for a \$50 fee. Keep in mind our budget is tight and if you are on the fence about having your vehicle judged or put in the For Sale area, your fees will be welcome!

Not a MVPA Member? There is a Way to Show Your MV

This is a MVPA International Convention and it is focused on members and their guests. It is also open to the public all days. But <u>only</u> MVPA members may show a MV. Being a MVCC member does not get you or your MV in. Elsewhere we talked about what a MVPA membership costs. Please join the MVPA if you can.

There is another way to get your MV into the show. Just find a MVPA member and pre-register as a <u>guest</u> on his/her form. Your MV is entered as if it is the members MV. The pre-printed window sign will carry the members name but you are welcome to hang out with it and say, "It's mine!"

No <u>discounts for committee members</u>. MVCC membership does not get you into this show - it's an MVPA convention. It is possible to buy a general admission wristband at the door but it's expensive on Thursday. Committee people should register to get a badge.

If you don't have your login name and password to see that section, which by the way is where you can view the latest MVCC News in color and other classified, super-secret, insider club info, contact Webmaster Sean Nichols. Camp Grizzly and Other Display Areas at the Convention

We are reviewing proposals for what people want to do in this lawn area just south of Building D. It is the only area suitable for tent pins within our show area where overnight camping is authorized. And unlike the Walnut Grove and Main Lot RV areas across the parking lot, Camp Grizzly is free! But only approved displays and camping using military equipment qualifies.

VP Scott Rohrs is the POC for this area and he wants to hear from you if you want to display something. Grizzly is for living historians, museum-type displays, and military tents or nets that can't go on pavement. We favor displays that are more than a simple military tent, although we want to know if you want to set up only a military tent for show, or want to sleep in it. Maybe we can make that happen. Get on our radar ASAP. If you want to do a display with a MV using no more space than the MV and maybe an easel sign and tool roll on the ground takes up, and pavement is OK, just register your MV and show up. If you request more space than that, or want to do something without a MV, contact either event co-chairman ASAP.

Walnut Grove and Main Lot RV Camping Areas at the Convention – Not Display Areas

Someone asked if these paid camping areas across the parking lot from our show can be visited by general spectators, and so could be an additional display or vendor area at our show. The Walnut Grove dry camping area will be off limits to the general public and not convenient to show attendees during the daytime. It is not part of our grounds rental for the show. We chose to do this so MVPA and MVCC do not have to run our own camping program as a profit (or loss) center. The Alameda County Fairgrounds Camp Host is running it. If it is an attraction that our attendees can visit, ACF will charge the MVPA rent.

Same goes for the Main Lot RV area. It's not for displays or vendors. If management sees this going on it will cost us money via ACF keeping our deposit.
