Dave has been working hard with the park and has informed me that there will be NO charge for day visitors and NO charge for parking on the levee.


If you are coming for the day please pay attention to where you park as parking by the boat sheds is for boat owners and will be a tow-away zone for us.



Scrunch Valley Patrol, FMC LVT(4) Shown during the Los Banos Raid, Philippines. 23 February 1945, which was executed by a combined U.S. Army Airborne and Filipino guerrilla task force, resulting in the liberation of 2,147 Allied civilian and military internees from an agricultural school campus turned Japanese internment camp. Coordinated Air, Land and Sea troops to include 54 LVT(4) tracked amphibious assault vehicles such as the one pictured of the 672nd Amphibian Tractor Battalion commanded by Lt. Col. Joseph W. Gibbs slipped into Laguna de Bay and headed for Mayondon Point, near San Antonio, The fifty four Amtracs of the 672nd Amphibious Battalion came ashore in nine columns of six vehicles after green smoke grenades were popped on San Antonio beach, the Amtracs reached the camp, knocking out a pillbox and crashed through the camp gate. A Military Vehicle "Crawling" Out of The Past.

While participating in the "Best of The West" Show in Santa Margarita, I spotted a unique WWI tractor used by the Allied Forces starting in 1916. "The War to End All Wars" was a transitional war moving from the horse drawn to motorized wheel vehicles. The battle field had advanced as well with many and larger Field Artillery pieces that out burdened the horse drawn teams and the period wheeled vehicles capability. The solution came from the United States agricultural industry a 9,200 pound "caterpillar" track layer supplied by HOLT Tractor Company.

The HOLT G-002, M-1917 Artillery Tractor (aka. Gun Tractor), 5 Ton, exceeded expectations with a 4 cylinder gas engine developing 56 H.P at 1200 R.P.M. and weighing 10,500 pounds when fully equipped with armor plating etc. Though it was heavy, the 9 inch and 11 inch grouser plate tracks displaced 5.6 and 4.5 pounds per square inch respectively. This "crawler" tractor had a 3-speed transmission: 1st at 1.41 M.P.H. for pulling heavy loads, 2nd (direct drive) at 3.92 MPH, and 3rd at 7.37 MPH for traveling. These crawlers were used predominately behind the line moving heavy ordinance equipment, pulling wagon supply trains, and accessing off-road locations with soft soil and uneven ground locations that period self powered wheel vehicles could not travel. What it could not do in speed, at 5'-3" wide it made up for in tight maneuvering with an outside turning diameter of 176" (14"-8"), inside diameter 48" (4 feet)! Not obvious at first, there seemed to be more concern about protecting the engine and ten gallon reserve gas tank than the operator, for there is no armor plating around the driver, only the seat back and two 12 gallon tanks on either side. As it had no battery, the "ARM"-strong starter crank rolled over the engine and magneto to get it going, and the driving lights were lit with kerosene. With its introduction into WWI, not only did it influence the development of the British, French, and later German tanks, it was also credited as a major factor in winning the war. HOLT licensed the production of many of its 5 and 10 ton tractors to MAXWELL Motor Company, Inc. and REO Motor Car Company as is this 1918 tractor. Between WWI and WWII Holt merged with C. L. Best Tractor and eventually became CATERPILLAR TRACTOR. Thomas Madden resides in Paso Robles and is the owner of this specimen as well as four other WWI track vehicles including a10 ton Military version under restoration as part of his collection.
