HOORAY! We are returning to **Tower Park April 21 thru 27, 2019.** Reservations for current MVCC members will be open June 1, 2018 by calling 209.369.1041. It is important to mention MVCC when making a reservation and to have your membership number handy. Reservations for non-MVCC members will be open July 1, 2018. The Camp Delta meet will be a 4 day minimum event however, early birds are always welcome. The MVCC will have campgrounds 2, 3, and 4 same as in years past. We will not have campground 1 (sites 1 thru 84). As we are starting over with this meet, all reservations will go thru the Tower Park reservation system. After this year reservations will go thru me.

Many improvements have been made at Tower Park. Some sites in campground 4 have paving now and are considered pull through sites. These sites are approximately 70 feet long. Certainly long enough to share with a buddy. There are new deluxe lodges as well as new cabins. Included in this newsletter is the current Tower Park site map. Please take a look at it and choose which site will best accommodate you. At the time you make your reservation you will be asked to place a deposit of 50% of the cost of your stay.

The remaining balance will be due at time of check-in. A member can reserve a total of 2 spaces. If you plan on reserving a space for a friend, the space will be in your name and it will be your responsibility to put down the required 50% deposit. Anyone looking for a tent site will need to confirm with Tower Park that the site chosen will accommodate ground spikes.

I am very excited about our return to Tower Park for our Spring 2019 campout and hope that you are excited as well. Dave has worked long and hard with the folks at Jellystone in hopes that this event goes off without any snafu's. When you see him walking around the campground be sure to give him a big Boo Boo Bear hug and say THANKS!

Hello Everybody:

It is just a couple weeks to Camp Petaluma. If you have not reserved a site yet, there may be one or two still available. To check on availability and reserve a site, you need to contact the KOA Reservations Desk at (707) 763-1492. The best way to get in is to have a campsite even if it is just a \$10 tent site. The alternative is ask a friend to add you as a guest on his campsite, even then parking will be very limited onsite. The lot across from the Henny Penny and the Cattleman's Steak House lot are the offsite parking choices. There are no shuttles. You need to call J's Taxi's (707) 364-1544. It is \$3 a mile. KOA will have an entrance fee of \$10 per head. If you are parked offsite and have heavy parts to move in or out, please come by the Headquarters trailer, and we will get you some help.

Johnny Verissimo is putting on the spring raffle at Petaluma. He needs donations of parts and other go-withs and for everyone to buy tickets to support the club. Come by the Rec Hall Friday evening and enjoy the food trucks and music. You can buy raffle tickets at the Headquarters trailer along with T-shirts and other MVCC merchandise.

In the last newsletter (Number 3), I promised to let everyone know where the April 23-28, 2019, swap meet would be held. After many phone calls and emails, I decided that most of the members felt that Petaluma KOA was not working. Many of the issues pointed out could not be ironed out with KOA and their rules. We went back to the drawing board, and some members and myself started looking for a replacement.

We visited a bunch of fairgrounds including Turlock and Pleasanton. They don't seem to offer what the members are asking for. While these venues offer many options, they have many issues as well. After a meeting at Pleasanton Fairgrounds with their staff, I decided it might be a good time to revisit Camp Delta, so I decided to give Paul, the Tower Park Manager, a call. From previous conservations that I had with Paul, I had the feeling that he would be hesitant at the suggestion of the MVCC coming back next April. To my surprise he was very receptive to having the MVCC back for our spring swapmeet.

The most basic details were discussed. I took this information to the board, and it was agreed upon that the April 2019 swapmeet will be held at Tower Park. Please everyone don't rush to the phone or jump in the truck because the park is going through many changes and is in a state of flux. Access is limited due to the construction and heavy equipment parked about. Some people found out about the change in venue and went to visit the park only to find closed roads and Campground Four under construction.



They will not address your issues regarding the swap meet. In June, we will open the reservations for members to Campground 2, 3 and 4 and be able to answer more questions. The dates are above. I will have an article next month with more info. Jellystone Park is not the same Tower Park campground, but it is flat and visitor friendly. There will be more info coming, so please sit tight. You can come by and see me at the Club's Headquarters trailer if you have questions.



Camp Petaluma Tips and Tricks Including How Do I Get In if I am a Day Visitor?

If you have access to the internet, please read about the meet on the event calendar page, especially Basic Training which has been updated since a month ago. It should answer most questions. Print it? You will see info about:

- Visitor admission fee \$10 per person per day
- 100 visitors maximum per day!
- Those who use campers' wristbands do not count against this limit
- Offsite parking is more flexible this year park anywhere that's legal
- Shuttle service \$3/mile/carload but operates any day or time. Bring a telephone to call J's Taxis at 707-364-1544. Website is www.petalumataxis.com. Company owned cars, employee drivers.
- Wristband nuances are discussed
- IF you book an inexpensive, Group Area nightly campsite, you get your wristband AND onsite parking. Call KOA ASAP 707-763-1492
- Campers can store trailers and extra vehicles in RV storage lot at north end of KOA, freeing up your space
- All MVs welcome in the campground we have several parking/display areas inside and outside the gate. If you
 have a MV and are a visitor, drive it in! Best trailer unloading spot for visitors is the dirt lot across from Pete's
 Henny Penny Restaurant .6 miles from KOA office. If you are a camper you can unload the trailer inside the
 campground and stash it at the RV storage lot. See the Schedule for more info about MV parking space
- An interactive campground map is on the website. See who is staying where. This should be updated soon If questions, contact Dave Ball, John Neuenburg, or if related to an activity, the Point of Contact shown in the schedule.

Cattlemen's Restaurant and Other Offsite Parking

The manager of Cattlemen's is OK with our visitors using his lot for parking. This nearby dinner-only place at 5012 Petaluma Blvd North is wide open all day but please park in the rear and pick up your shuttle in front. Do not park on the left in front of Jay Palms Saddle Shop and Budget. Best to not store your trailer or truck/trailer there especially after 6 pm when the dinner rush happens. Visitors' trailers should go in the dirt lot across from Pete's Henny Penny restaurant. If you eat at Cattlemen's, try to meet the manager John and thank him for letting us park there (whether you used the lot or not). He is hoping our folks don't take up too much space on Friday and Saturday during the 6:30-9pm rush, but the more of us who have dinner there, the happier he will be!

Note that for taking J's Taxis to and from KOA from there, it is 1.2 miles to KOA but only .8 mile back, due to the odd way the roads work. 2 mile round trip = \$6.

There is a dirt lot a little closer to KOA that we might obtain. Check the Event Forum on www.G503.com for news. It is NORTH of Rainsville Road on Stony Point Road, first gate on the right, at the "Pumpkin Patch" field that locals are familiar with. Not the whole field, just the small lot in front, so save room for cars and pickups. Store trailers at the Henny Penny lot.

Those renting cabins, campsites, or Group Area spots do not follow the above procedure. Park at your site or store trailers and extra cars in the RV storage lot by our north camp area inside KOA.

Really the best plan for a visitor not driving a MV in, is to rent an inexpensive site in the KOA Group Camp Area to get a wristband AND onsite parking. This area will probably sell out so call KOA soon at 707-763-1492.



KOA management will allow MVs to drive into the campground without a camper parking pass, but passengers should have their camper or day-visitor wristband with them.






