








Hagerty to Sponsor the Camp Plymouth Truck Showcase

One of the two themed vehicle showcases planned for Friday April 19 will be Ford GTBs and Chevrolet M6 Bomb Service Trucks Presented by Hagerty. POC Don Gomes reports that it is time for the GTB series of trucks to get their place in the sun. Rumors are out there that some trucks never seen at our big meets will show up. Could our display set a Western U.S. record? It is also time to throw a bone to the rare Chevy bomb truck owners. One reason they are being included is that they are so rare it would be tough to have an impressive display all by themselves. Another reason is there will be at least one GTB bomb truck there, so the Chevy and Ford designs can be compared side-by-side. Great idea Don!

This showcase will include a People's Choice Contest with cash prizes courtesy of Hagerty Collector Vehicle Insurance. YOU get to vote for your favorite! Hagerty provides insurance to the MVCC and is the insurer for many of the classic MVs we will see in Plymouth. They have also sponsored awards at many Military Vehicle Preservation Association National Conventions and the Youth Judging Programs at each. This program was started in 2007 and they host these for children ages 8 to 14 at over 100 classic car and boat shows throughout the U.S., Canada, and the UK. Young judges are guided through a group of pre-selected vehicles to learn details, history, and fun facts about each. A simplified score card is used. They offer a kit for car show promoters who want to incorporate youth judging at their show. This is part of the Hagerty Youth Advocacy Program, along with Hagerty Test Garage and Hagerty Driving Program for young adults.

Hagerty representative Joe Giuntini will be camping most likely in RV site 34 and will have information about insurance, their new Hagerty Driver's Club which has evolved from the Hagerty Plus Roadside Assistance product, and the youth programs mentioned above. For information see www.Hagerty.com.

Next was to put the dash in and windshield frame then front fenders, steps, grill, inner glass, bumper and side tool box . Then it was time to set the bed on rear fenders and bolt it all down with the original bolts washers and nuts . After the bed was bolted down and rear bed cap we set the crane and winches on . So note that this single rear wheel GTBS did not have rear bumperettes from the factory . The next job on Froggy was to paint all the lettering and hood numbers so Johnny V ordered decal stencils from the UK about a month before we needed them . 





The Un-Official Guide to Places to Stay near Camp Plymouth

This list is not comprehensive and provides a variety of places to stay near Camp Plymouth. Of course, we recommend staying at Camp Plymouth (the 49'er RV Park or next door in the tent camping area). If you prefer a hotel, here is a suggested list. We haven't tried all of these but they seem to have good reviews. And, please know that this list does NOT guarantee that the hotels have availability. Pricing varies depending on how many rooms are available, whether you're staying on a weekday or on the weekend.

Plymouth

Shenandoah Inn. A couple blocks from Camp Plymouth. Small, older hotel with spacious rooms and a good view from the large windows. Parking lot. Very close and some MVCC members have reservations there already.

Plymouth House Inn. Bed and breakfast on Main Street in downtown Plymouth. Being on Main Street, parking is limited to lots to the back and side streets.

Rest - A Boutique Hotel. Also on Main Street. Parking is limited.

Amador City – About 9 minutes from Camp Plymouth. Small town popular with antique hunters.

Imperial Hotel. B&B - An 1879 brick hotel turned into a B&B. Full breakfast, saloon and on-site restaurant. Parking limited.

lone - About 13 minutes from Camp Plymouth.

Ione Hotel. – Renovated hotel that reflects its history of the early 1900's. Free wireless. Bar and restaurant on the property.

<u>Jackson</u> – 15 to 20 minutes from Camp Plymouth, right on Hwy 49. Downtown is a Historic Gold Rush town with narrow streets and quaint shops. Outside downtown, there's lots of shopping, restaurants and reasonably-priced chain hotels. Walmart and the hospital are also in Jackson.

Best Western Amador Inn. Free internet, parking and breakfast. On Hwy. 49. They have some pet-friendly rooms (extra charges apply). Rooms have refrigerator, microwave, coffee/tea maker, etc.

Holiday Inn Express & Suites. Free internet, parking and breakfast. On Hwy. 49. Rooms have refrigerator, microwave, coffee maker, etc.

National Hotel. An old, historic renovated hotel originally built in 1862. This historic hotel is in the middle of downtown, which can be fairly congested. Parking for hotel guests, but there might not be room for trailer parking.

Jackson Lodge. This small hotel site has 28 hotel rooms and 8 guest cabins. Wi-fi and breakfast NOT included. Each room has a coffee maker, TV, blow dryer and basic amenities.

<u>Jackson Rancheria</u>. Casino and Hotel 20 minutes (14.5 miles) from Camp Plymouth. This place is east of Jackson, between Jackson and Sutter Creek. Lots of parking. Buffet onsite in addition to gambling and entertainment.

Sutter Creek – Historic Gold Rush town about 13 minutes from Camp Plymouth

Hotel Sutter. This historic hotel sits in the middle of downtown Sutter Creek. Free wi-fi but parking is limited to side streets. There is a restaurant and 2 bars onside as well as other nearby restaurants.

Grey Gables Bed & Breakfast. This is a beautiful old house in Sutter Creek with luxurious guest rooms and a full breakfast. Parking is limited.

Hanford House Inn. There are 16 guest rooms in this location and it's at one end of downtown Sutter Creek. Unlike most B&B's, the atmosphere here is modern and the breakfast is at the Elements restaurant next door.




















Camp Plymouth - Not Just for the Guys


