


South S.F. Bay Area VP Report

Important Announcement: MVCC Newsletter Going to Electronic Delivery.

Some of you have probably heard by now that the MVCC Board has decided after several years of discussion and debate to take the club's newsletter to the next level and deliver it by email to its members. Starting with the last quarter of 2010, the newsletter was for the first time only delivered to all MVCC members by logging into a private member only area on the MVCC website.

The MVCC has offered this as an option ever since that time to all members in hopes everyone would see the cost savings to both the club and its members. Only 10 percent of the members have taken advantage of the online version. This includes members overseas. The MVCC board has been putting off raising dues for several years to the level needed to sustain the newsletter printing, labels and postage. It's never easy to raise dues. All members pay them even board members. Watching the costs go up and the treasury drain is very troubling. The board would like to have the funds available to provide other activities at the MVCC swapmeets and to purchase the super high quality, but expensive to design and manufacture, multicolor event t-shirts. All of these treasury expenditures directly benefit the MVCC members. Spending the treasury on mailing the newsletter out by postal delivery makes many of these things impossible.

After this year, we will be forced to increase dues, cut back on t-shirts, and other items that the club's quarter masters trailer has for sale, and remove 2 to 4 pages out of the newsletter or maybe even go to a semi-annual publication 6 times a year if we don't go electronic. It was put to a vote and passed unanimously by the board that the newsletter will be delivered monthly by email, if possible, instead of on the website.

This will effectively start with a trial run in July 2019, after any bugs in the email list is worked out with a first test in June. I will also send the June newsletter out by postal and to Sean to post on the webpage as usual, but I will also test everyone's email addresses and their email providers delivery system. Look for these tests in June and or July and reply back that you received the email.

To do this, I will send everyone a link to download the newsletter from a delivery service that I use called We Transfer. This will allow us a work around for email providers that do not allow large attachments or if you have a slow internet connection.

If this works, it will save the club \$9000 a year and untold hours of manual labor by the editor and his support staff. Instead of folding, labeling, adding postage stamps and stuffing 400 envelopes, they will be charged with maintaining an email list with the help of the club's Secretary who maintains the club's roster. If you have not given Johnny Verissimo your current email address, you will want to send him an email, so he can update the roster. I am hoping we can count on everyone's cooperation and patience in this endeavor to bring our club's newsletter into the electronic age. It will save us all some money that can be spent on parts for the projects we all have and club merchandise and event entertainment and such.




