IV Corps took part in the fighting through the summer of 1944, as the Fifth Army, under the command of Lieutenant General Mark W. Clark. In the autumn and winter of 1944, the IV Corps formed the central wing of the Fifth Army's sector, taking a major role in the Fifth Army's assault on the Gothic Line fighting to break through to the Lombardy plains beyond. In the spring of 1945 the corps, still the Fifth Army's central sector, took part in the successful Italian spring offensive breaking out of the Apennines to outflank German Tenth and Fourteenth Armies defending Bologna forming a pincer with the Eighth Army to surround them, and then driving on to the River Po and finally Verona and Brescia.

The corps was inactivated on 13 October 1945, at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey.
