



It has come to our attention that some collectors at recent club meets have been using incorrect nomenclature and terminology. For your benefit we are providing the following glossary of commonly used military vehicle terms.

MILITARY VEHICLE COLLECTOR'S GLOSSARY

Compiled by Phil Kern

Ambulance-A large, boxy, enclosed military vehicle used for transporting wounded and storing parts for other military vehicles.

Amphibious Vehicle-A vehicle that can float and propel itself in water, and can also double as a submarine depending on who performed the restoration.

APC-A tracked armored vehicle that typically contains combat equipped troops as well as the owner's life savings.

Articulated-An military vehicle collector that can read, speak and write understandably. Very rare. Axle-A collector that reneges on a deal or sells parts that are not as advertised, as in "Sam is the world's biggest axle."

Boot-Old English term for the trunk or rear portion of a vehicle. Also what you get when you don't pay for your club dues or campsite reservation.

Bubba-Large mythological creature that inhabits areas where historic military vehicles may be found. Similar to Bigfoot, only less knowledgeable and less skilled. Known for such things as removing and discarding rare original parts, welding 90 lb. bumpers to WW2 jeeps, and using safety pins or paper clips as electrical components.

Cammies-Short for camouflaged military clothing. Ideal for collectors as they hide stains from hot sauce, oil, mustard, brake fluid, beer, drool, etc.

Combat Wheel-A two-piece wheel that bolts together for changing tires in the field. So named because when spotted simultaneously by multiple collectors at a swap meet, mortal combat ensues.

Dropside Bed-Special mattress for MV collectors that dumps them on the floor one hour before the swap meet opens.

Duesenhoff-A three axle, 6x6 military truck rated at two- and one-half tons capacity.

Flathead-A collector that is not the sharpest tool in the shop.

"Follow Me" Jeep-A jeep painted in an unusual pattern to attract attention at military vehicle meets. May usually be followed to the liquor store in between painting sessions.

Ford-A WW2 MV manufacturer. Known for leaving three letters off their name on all the parts they produced.

Gama Goat-Infrequently heard military vehicle designation. Infrequently heard because the vehicle is so loud every **Gremlin**-Small mythological creature known to inhabit extremely basic and simple military vehicle components. Known to come and go as they please.

Greyhound-A WW2 armored vehicle that will require EMTs to extract you from the driver's seat. Also, a refreshment you will need to recover after your extraction.

Groundpounder-Collector willing to walk long distances at an RV park to find the parts they need. **Hero/Heroine**-Any person that has served in the armed forces and been shot at, survived on MREs, been separated from their families for more than six months or had to use an open pit latrine.

Hood-Area where your friends and vehicles reside.

Humvee-A common military vehicle in use worldwide since the 1980s, without the approval of the California DMV.

Jeep-Small military vehicle with a large price tag.

Kettenkrad-A small, noisy, tracked foreign military vehicle powered by Schnapps, and typically operated during late night hours.

Locking Differential-The temperature difference between your house and your shop, when your wife locks you out of the former and tells you to spend the night in the latter.

Lowball-An inappropriate offer made by a fellow collector. Typically occurs during a "fishing expedition". **NDT**-Acronym for a standard military tire. Stands for "No Dang Traction" in any conditions or on any type of surface.

M-Series-Phrase commonly used by MV collectors: "Mmmmmmmm...how much is that GPW?"

Mighty Mite-Lightweight military vehicle used exclusively by the US Marine Corps. Known for its ability to drive on three wheels if the driver is properly loaded.

Mule-Vietnam vintage lightweight military vehicle. Named after a stubborn quadruped due to the manually operated pull starter used on most versions. Everybody in the area has to wear hearing protection when it is running.

Multifuel-An MV collector that continues to function after consuming beer, vodka, tequila and whiskey in any combination.

MUTT-Acronym for a marginally stable military vehicle. Also, a neighbor's pet that leaves an unwanted landmine in your campsite.

Naturally Aspirated-A non-smoking military vehicle meet. Also, a non-turbocharged MV.

No-Fly Zone-The immediate area around your camp's bug zapper.

Mechanic-A military vehicle owner.

Military Vehicle-A slow, noisy, uncomfortable, unsafe, expensive and odiferous conveyance that is worshipped by its owner.

Overrestored-A vehicle in far better condition than when it left the factory. Essentially, most MVs. **Six by Six**-The apparent size of a typical swap meet spot.

Socket-Commonly used hand tool that when dropped is scientifically designed to roll directly under the center of mass of a military vehicle.

Split Ring-What your wedding band will become when your wife finds out you brought home another military vehicle.

Tank-What your bank account will do if you buy one.

Torque-A quirky, goofy or strange MV collector. Basically most of them.

Tracked Vehicle-A vehicle using caterpillar tracks for mobility. Exponentially more cool, expensive and slower than a wheeled vehicle.

Trailer Queen-A military vehicle whose tires have never touched bare earth.

Unobtanium-Extremely rare and expensive heavy metal element.

Willys-Well known military vehicle manufacturer with a name nobody knows how to pronounce correctly. **Winch**-A mechanically, hydraulically or electrically operated cable device used for pulling vehicles over or through obstacles. For some reason frequently confused with an attractive young woman, or wench.


