

Howdy MV'ers,

It's a bummer about the cancellation of our spring event. I was really excited about this years showcases and getting to see everyone again. Assuming our world will come back to some levels of normalcy soon, we can focus on a much bigger fall event. As I was preparing for the April event, I came to the realization that I wasn't going to have the HEMTT fixed in time to bring it so, on a positive note for myself, I have more time to get it back on the road for the next event. Regarding the HEMTT, I pulled the remaining parts including the aftercooler, turbo and supercharger. I had the aftercooler checked and cleaned. No issues to report on that. I didn't see any visible cracks on the heads but I was concerned there may be something there I can't see. I decided to have them checked. I called around to get pricing for having the heads magnafluxed. Most shops told me they didn't work on heads that big. I found one shop in West Sacramento that quoted me \$275.00 each YIKES. I happen to be working in Reno for the next few months so I called shops in the Reno, Sparks area. I found a shop called Aims in Sparks NV. They quoted me \$80.00 for both. I tore down the heads leaving only the exhaust valves. After disassembly, I muscled them into the back of my truck for the ride to Reno. let me tell ya, them puppies are heavy. The shop performed the magnaflux As well as a vacuum test. They passed the tests but were Warped about .010" so they ended up resurfacing the heads. I picked them up and I can say they did a nice job and the prices were way better than others. I recommend Aims in Sparks NV for engine machine shop work. The engine rebuild kit is now on order so I need to have enough room to access the main bearings. In order to get better access to the motor, I pulled the front tires off the HEMTT. They are 500 lbs. each so I needed to be careful not to let them fall over or worst yet, fall over on me so I strapped them to the side of my deuce. If you ever wondered what a deuce would look like with 1600 X 20 tires...here you go...Next month I'll update the rebuilding process on the HEMTT motor. I'm also still offering free food and adult beverages in exchange for labor.

In regards to upcoming events, I'm assuming there will be cancellations until this virus passes us by so stay tuned and let me know about any events that are going on so I can share them with others. 
