

Here ya go: Another GTBA

One of the GTBs I acquired a few years ago has an interesting story. Well they all do, but this one has a few twists...

The GTB was owned by a farmer in Fallon, Nevada, inherited from his father. He no longer had a use for it and was planning on scrapping it if no one wanted it. I saw his post on the G503 forum and decided to take it off his hands for little more than scrap value. You can see what it looked like in the photos. It' a GTBA cargo truck and had an extended frame and no bed, but it supposedly ran. The original passenger seat was included, retrieved from a tractor where it was serving as the driver's seat. The original driver's seat was there as well. The blackout driving light was also still there, complete with the original, correct, tombstone guard. The passenger seat and blackout light are a rare find on a GTB project, almost never included with the truck. It had original paint and the markings were still visible, including "US NAVY ORDNANCE" on the hood. The original data plates were still on the engine cover. The winch was missing (can't have everything...) but I happened to have a spare GTB winch, so that wasn't a problem. Too good to pass up! I paid for it and then waited a few weeks for the weather to clear up before making the trip to Fallon to pick it up. As it turned out, the owner (who was in the scrap business) was planning a trip to California and volunteered, for a small fee, to deliver the truck to my address, saving me the trouble of a trip to Fallon. The first thing I did after it arrived was cut off the frame extension and relocate the rear axle

While the truck was posted on the "G", a gentleman in Northern Arizona posted that he had an original GTB cargo bed for sale, cheap, to go with

the Fallon truck. The bed came with the tailgate, original mud flaps and had an original fuel tank still installed. It even had its military tail lights! I got in touch with him and arranged to pick it up... didn't seem that far to go to get it, all things considered, so off we went with the trailer to Arizona. To date, it's the only complete GTB cargo bed I've ever seen for sale, except for beds still attached to the truck.

So now I have a complete cargo truck, ready and waiting for restoration (too many projects, not enough time...). I installed the cargo bed and I plan on getting it ready for the much anticipated Spring 2022 GTB Showcase at Camp Plymouth. I've driven it and fixed the brakes. I'll most likely end up driving it to Plymouth.

- 1. C. All the vehicles noted have portal axles with reduction gears on the ends of the axles.
- 2. B. On an H drive vehicle a gearbox in the center of the vehicle splits the drive to bevel boxes on each side, which then power driveshafts running down either side, which then power the wheels via another set of bevel boxes. Very complicated and maintenance intensive.
- 3. C. Patton was a four star general at the time of his death in December 1945.
- 4. B. Known as the "Maus" (mouse), the combat weight of the super heavy Panzerkampfwagen VIII tank was over 200 short tons, the equivalent of six M4 Sherman tanks. Only two chassis and one turret were built in 1944, and it was to be armed with a 128mm main gun and a 75mm coaxial gun.
- 5. D. MacArthur's personal aircraft was originally a B-17E named after the peninsula in the Philippines where his troops made a last stand against the Japanese in early 1942. Later he used a C-54 named "Bataan II".
- 6. B. An acronym for NEtherlands KAiser Frasier, a slightly modified M38A1 was produced initially with imported US parts, and later with locally made parts. M38A1s served the Dutch military for over 40 years.



What was I thinking? We have all been there. You see an ad for a mv and you just have to have it. Well this is a short story of my latest mv. I've been looking for a WC-51/2 for our local mailman. He likes the look of the trucks and wants one as a father/son project. I've found several project WCs, but all were a little too rough for his skill set. Finally I found an ad on Facebook Marketplace for a mining core drill. 
