



Happy New Year and I hope the weather is not treating you too badly. Here in the East Bay it's been an adventure, but we're still staying dry and the house has not slid into the creek, though the street may. I wish the M37 was finished because the winch and 4wd could have been helpful dealing with downed trees. In regard to local events it's been quiet, but if you're aware of any on the horizon please contact me so I can post them.

At the Shop the kids and I are buried in piles of parts from various projects, including the M37's. We may be embarking on a 230 flathead rebuild depending on what we uncover this week inside Pete's old motor. I scuffed the cylinder walls in mine last year so it's done for now. We did get a opportunity to check out Pete's gearbox and it looks great. I suspect it was replaced somewhere along the line since it's red oxide primer instead of the factory silver. Fortunately, it was unscathed by the fire. If we embark on an engine rebuild I need some suggestions from you guys. Over the past few years it's become harder and harder to find a good machine shop in the East Bay. S&S is around the corner, but they are not terribly interested in touching an old flathead. The other shops I've used have closed. If you have any recommendations, please get in touch. If we do dive into another rebuild I plan on doing a few things differently since our last 230 to further improve the performance. Mind you, we're talking about a max RPM of 3000 so the details matter. We had good luck with the prior motor (until I wounded it...) so we'll see what happens. If I find a machine shop that's willing to work with us, maybe we'll even build up a spare and you'd get to suffer through a series of articles on a rebuild :) ! Hope your winter projects are going well and are ready to roll by April!







I've been soaking the bolts on the HEMTT crane cylinder in preparation for removal. I finally hit them with the impact wrench and have them broken loose with no damage. Now I'll be able to start pounding out those 2.5" diameter pins that hold in the cylinder. That's a workout in itself. Expect to see some pictures next month.

I've also been fighting with "Rusty" the M16 halftrack. Apparently, it doesn't want to let go of all those frozen armored bolts and nuts. They are all so rusted and stuck. I pulled out the 36" breaker bar...now I really mean business...I wrestled with the truck for several hours. After removing several items under the hood, I was able to get to the worst of the rusted nuts and was able to cut them off. I got the windshield removed. I'm now almost down to the firewall. YEEHAA! A few more pieces and I'll be ready to pull the radiator, motor and tranny.

I pulled one of the original gauges from the rusted dashboard. Do you think I can rebuild this one?

Maybe some bondo will do the trick? I removed the carburetor from the engine. I'd say it's been sitting in the weather for almost as long as that gauge. I turned the carburetor over and this stuff poured out the top.

Looks like some critter was storing some winter supplies in there. Other than the little treats inside, the carb looks like a good candidate for a rebuild. I'll add that to the growing list of projects for this halftrack.







Happy New Year from the central coast! I was very fortunate to visit Belgium, Luxembourg, and the tip of northern France the week prior to Christmas. The goal was to check off one of my bucket list items and explore the sites correlating to the Battle of the Bulge. Our Flight departed San Francisco on Dec. 16th and headed non-stop to Frankfurt and then a brief puddle jumps on to Luxemburg City. Our trip dates correlated almost perfectly to the events surrounding the battle of the bulge exactly 78 years earlier. We had a wonderful vacation rental situated just outside the city of Bastogne. Coincidentally this home served as the HQ for the 101st Airborne as the siege of Bastogne developed in the latter parts of December of 1944. In addition, the Chateau served as the site of the awards ceremony held in January 1945 for the 101st. We toured many of the villages

and towns involved in the offensive both in Belgium and Luxembourg. One of the big things that grabs your attention is the fact that the American Flag has been flying for the past 78 years side by side with the host country. It truly puts the historic role that the American serviceman has made in so many lives on foreign soil. The Bastogne War Museum is one the finest museums I have had an opportunity to tour. It does an excellent job portraying the precursors to World War II and of course a heavy emphasis on the battle of the bulge.

A wonderful day was spent driving south from Belgium into northern France where we had opportunity to visit the American Cemetery at Meuse Argonne. I thought this would be a valuable history lesson for my 9-year-old Hunter and his 11 year old brother Maxwell. This is the largest American cemetery on foreign soil and a very powerful place.

We made a brief stop at the Battle of Verdun visitor center which I highly recommend as well.

The Meuse-Argonne offensive was a major part of the fi-

nal Allied offensive of World War I that stretched along the entire Western Front. It was fought from September 26, 1918, until the Armistice of November 11, 1918, a total of 47 days. The Meuse–Argonne offensive was the largest in United States military history, involving 1.2 million American soldiers. It is also the deadliest battle in the history of the United States Army, resulting in over 350,000 casualties, including 28,000 German lives, 26,277 American lives and an unknown number of French lives. American losses were worsened by the inexperience of many of the troops, the tactics used during the early phases of the operation and the widespread onset of the global influenza outbreak called the "Spanish flu".

The **Battle of the Bulge** the last major German offensive campaign on the Western Front during World War II. The battle lasted from 16 December 1944 to 28 January 1945, towards the end of the war in Europe. It was launched through the densely forested Ardennes region between Belgium and Luxembourg. It overlapped with the Alsace Offensive and subsequently the Colmar Pocket, another series of battles launched by the Germans in support of the Ardennes thrust.

The primary military objectives were to deny further use of the Belgian port of Antwerp to the Allies and to split the Allied lines, which potentially could have allowed the Germans to encircle and destroy the four Allied forces. The Battle of the Bulge remains among the most important battles of the war, as it marked the last major offensive attempted by the Axis Powers

on the Western front. After their defeat, Germany would retreat for the remainder of the war. The Germans achieved a total surprise attack

on the morning of 16 December 1944, due to a combination of Allied overconfidence, preoccupation with Allied offensive plans, and poor aerial reconnaissance due to bad weather

American forces bore the brunt of the attack. The Germans at-

tacked a weakly defended section of the Allied line, taking advantage of heavily overcast weather conditions that grounded the Allies' superior air forces. Fierce American resistance on the northern shoulder of the offensive, around Elsenborn Ridge, and in the south, around Bastogne, blocked German access to key roads to the northwest and west that they counted on for success.

The farthest west the offensive reached was the village of Foy-Nôtre-Dame, south east of Dinant, being stopped by the U.S. 2nd Armored Division on 24 December 1944.^[18] Improved weather conditions from around 24 December permitted air attacks on German forces and supply lines, which sealed the failure of the offensive. On 26 December the lead element of Patton's U.S. Third Army reached Bastogne from the south, ending the siege. Although the offensive was effectively broken by 27 December, when the trapped units of 2nd Panzer Division made two break-out attempts with only partial success, the battle continued for another month before the front line was effectively restored to its position prior to the attack. In the wake of the defeat, many experienced German units were out of men and equipment, and the survivors retreated to the Siegfried Line.

The Germans' initial attack involved 410,000 men; just over 1,400 tanks, tank destroyers, and assault guns; 2,600 artillery pieces; and over 1,000 combat aircraft, as well as large numbers of other armored fighting vehicles (AFVs).^[5] From among the Americans' peak strength of 610,000 troops, there were 89,000 casualties, including about 19,000 killed.^[19] The "Bulge" was the largest and bloodiest single battle fought by the United States in World War II^{[20][21]}

^[22] and the third-deadliest campaign in American history.

This original WWII Jeep chat room also provided many of his new friends a place to learn and promote the military vehicle scene. Those chats also led to constant meetings outside the MVCC with a group of Jeep builders led by Mike Stopforth at his Santa Rosa - Mikes Military Motors where Chuck was a regular. There he gained skills as a restorer and knowledge of parts and history of the Jeep.

Our condolences to Irene his wife and family as well as to the many friends of his that will never forget about his knowledge of WWII Jeeps, history of WWII battles and the wonderful database of WWII trailers that he shared with the hobbyists across the internet. His dedication to that subject made him one of the "go-to" guys for information related to the MBT trailers. He was always a friend to the guys in the Odd Squad and will surely be missed by us all.


Since then, at age 37, my son Nathan age 10, and father Rick Farley age 72, have increased our vehicle projects to include the following.

I also operate a small museum out of my office in Durham containing local and Family history. My grandfather, Robert Farley WW2 1942-1945, my father Rick Vietnam 70-71 served 30 years active and National Guard retiring a First Sergeant. I also served in the Army deploying to Iraq in 2004-2005.

Many of our projects are still under restoration with the WC-4 and Halftrack on schedule to be finished in 2023.











About the Half Track;

Ever since as I watched the movie Kelly's Heroes I have always loved halftracks. I found two from different friends of mine in Nevada that I'm making into one solid halftrack. Like every new vehicle, I have had so much to learn, parts to find, and met some great people along the way.

My markings for the halftrack like all of my vehicles have a personal family connection. My mother was born in Holland and moved to the United States when she was 8. My grandparents lived in occupied Holland during the war and in May 1940, the 2nd Battalion, Irish Guards deployed to the Hook of Holland to cover the evacuation of the Dutch Royal Family and Government. The Irish Guards were then chosen to be part of the ground force of Operation Market Garden, one of the most ambitious operations of the entire war and designed to enable a swift advance into Germany by capturing vital bridges over the River Rhine. The 2nd Irish Guards led XXX Corps in their advance towards Arnhem. So my plan is to do my marking on my halftrack as the 2nd battalion Irish Guards in honor of them. Bringing that small connection to history with this vehicle.


Our Field Trip to Jimmy Strauss Jeep Restorations, by Johnny Verissimo
