SS Jeremiah O'Brien Liberty Ship 80th Birthday Cruise and MV Display Likely Dates August 19-20, 2023 at New Location in San Francisco By John Neuenburg

The only unmodified, fully operational WWII Liberty Ship in the world is turning 80 this June. The National Liberty Ship Memorial is planning a Saturday Bay cruise and static Sunday public open house with engine running at their new location on the west side of Pier 35. We have been invited to display WWII vehicles next to the ship. Those bringing a MV will receive a cruise ticket and another if a co-driver! Those wanting to stay aboard the ship that weekend are welcome in the open berthing area they use for group overnights like for Sea Scouts. No charge, see details below. Lunch is included aboard the ship when cruising. They hope we will stay for the Sunday public open house. I asked if a discount for a future cruise could be given to people who display a MV on Sunday. My contact thinks that is possible. This would include the Fleet Week cruises in October, a very special way to watch the Blue Angels and other aviation acts.

Pier 35 West is an upgrade from their relatively hidden location at Pier 45 at Fisherman's Wharf. The move was due to the big Pier 45 fire that burned the shed (the building on the pier) next to the ship. The ship was saved by the SFFD fire boat except for some scorched paint. But the shed which blocked much of the prevailing wind is gone and the wind has been causing mooring lines to snap. Pier 35 is a backup cruise ship terminal and on its west side the wind will blow the ship toward the pier, solving the line problem. The ship is in full view of the busy Pier 39 dining and shopping destination because there is no Pier 37. Part of their deal is the Pier 35 shed is available for O'Brien staff parking when there is no cruise ship visiting. This includes us unloading and parking trucks and trailers inside for this weekend. The MVs will park along the pier's apron between ship and shed so the cruising public and Sunday visitors will walk right by us.





RSVP to me, space is limited for the cruise and on the apron. Numbers are fuzzy as of this writing. 20 MVs should be OK. All must be U.S. WWII. No RV camping inside the shed. Shed and apron are locked at night and during the cruise. If anyone wants to move a MV into the shed at night that is OK. There will be a procedure for walking in and out of the shed gate to go to breakfast, dinner, or shopping, probably using our own combo lock on the gate.

One of the themes is "Wartime San Francisco" and they encourage the wearing of WWII era Class A, B, or field U.S. uniforms or period civilian clothes. Combat equipment and guns is not what they are looking for. They hope we can provide a variety of MVs, meaning not 20 jeeps. I will ask if they would like to winch a vehicle off the ground for show, maybe even to their deck. That would be great for a Navy or USMC jeep with lifting eyes. Anyone interested

in that? Volunteer docents will talk about the Merchant Marine, Navy Armed Guards, engine, deck equipment, guns, etc. The organizers are seeking warbirds for fly-bys in San Pablo Bay (attacks?). These cruises are really special.

I am POC for this event. Who wants to do it? Let me know year, make, model MV, driver and co-driver name, which days, overnight Friday and/or Saturday or not. Let me know if you want to do a living history impression without MV. The dates will be firmed up later. The open berthing area is very communal, four bunks high. The top ones are only for the athletic.
Bedding, pillows, ear plugs not provided. Tables, chairs, refrigerator, microwave, sink are there. There is a head (restroom) close and showers up a deck.

Starboard side now faces the Pier 39 shopping and dining hot spot. Great location!

Hello from The Netherlands, by Remko Gooijert

My name is Remko Gooijert a 46 years old MV enthusiast who lives in The Netherlands. I came in contact with the MVCC by your secretary / news letter editor Johnny. Johnny is also the moderator of the Ford GTB facebook page. The GTB was a truck topping my wish-list for I think 2 decades. The time was right that, in December 2020, I bought a very well preserved April / may -1944 Ford GTB Cargo with a winch from Don Gomes. And there it all started.

Well, it all started in the summer of 1996 when I was traveling in the holidays with my parents. We had planed to go to Normandy for a week and then continue to Cherbourg, catch the ferry to the UK and hit sights there from incl London.

We were in Normandy, I think at the American Cemetery in Colleville-sur-Mer, where there were 2 jeeps parked at the gate. One towing a nice ¼ ton trailer and the other one without. We talked to the Dutch owners and from there on we got "the green flu". That autumn and winter we scavenged the newspapers to find a jeep. We knew about the fact that there were 2 types, war time MB and GPW and the post war license build French Hotchkiss. To prevent ending up with a post war one, we contacted a member of Keep Them Rolling. Keep Them Rolling is the Dutch "rolling museum" for vehicles, vessels and planes produced, and used by any forces during WW2. This association has about 1500 members in different countries. The Netherlands, Germany, Belgium, Luxembourg, Austria, New Zeeland, Australia and many other. We have around 1800 - 2000 privately owned (and maintained) vehicles.

After an initial buy, and a further inspection by a technical staff member of the Dutch "Keep them Rolling". We went to become a member of this MV association.

After a few events in 1997 - 2002 and taking out all the initial

flaws of the jeep (gearbox was bad when we bought it and we snapped a drive-shaft) the search for a second vehicle began, at least for me... The jeep was (and still is) my dad's. As soon as the interest in ww2 vehicles landed in 1996, I more frequently saw the somewhat strange configuration of the G622, Ford GTB. I started doing some research but it was a very little known about vehicle here in Europe. Apart from some pictures of the Weymouth port prior to D-Day were there are 3 GTB's showing and the fact that the Royal Dutch Marine had 60 of them post war. The search began. There was one put up one for sale in the early 2000's and I was hooked. It was a bit disappointing that the seller wanted more than my bank account stored at that time. And, as far as I recall it, he tried to 'scam' me by selling a Bomb-truck chassis to me. It should be delivered with a correct cargo bed to make it complete, telling me it had overloads for more carrying capacity. A second throw back was the fact that is had been sitting outside in the Dutch weather for years and was pretty rusted out.

Nevertheless I bought a 2nd 'vehicle' not long after that. A colleague of mine offered me a pretty rough, farmer used", barn find ½ ton trailer with a cut out tailgate, no floor and some tractor front tires (on rusted out combat wheels).

This trailer I restored from 2005 onwards. It was 2010 when it did help in carrying the stuff to it's first events. Note, the trailer has 2 (rare) Canadian modifications. 1) the tandem setup, a pintle attached to the rear cross member, supported from 2 reinforcement struts. And 2) the heavier 10CWT springs. To fit these longer springs for more pay-load, the spring hangers needed to be spaced further apart and reinforcement plates had to be welded on to the frame.

In the years following I kept searching for a better GTB. Then when I met my wife (in 2007), we bought a house, got 3 kids and priorities shifted.

From 2007 – 2020 the green flu almost cured. Attending to a few local events, and only taking the jeep out for a Sunday's ride.

In September of 2020 I came across the GTB FB page. Sadly a nice GTB just had been sold. But, a few days later pictures appeared of Don and Johnny retrieving 2 or 3 other GTB's in and saw a nice GTB for sale at Don's place.

We decided to buy it. It was pretty complete, missing only the canvas, spare carrier and the passenger seat. To be sure of some hard to find mechanical spares, I bought an extra engine, transfer-case and steering box. This was stowed in the bed during shipment in January – March 2021

Some gauges were busted \square but the speedo is still functioning with only showing 8822 miles driven from new. It's nice to know that the busted

gauges are the same as jeep, so they are readily available.

I took delivery of the GTB on April 19th 2021.

Since then I'm in the process of restoring this vehicle. Axles, springs, chassis and wheels are done. TC has been hung under for now (need to lower it for the speedo


