Offsite MV Excursion on Thursday with lunch options, in the historic 19th century town of Locke. This is next to Walnut Grove which is north of Isleton on Hwy 160 or the county road next to the river. The Locke Historic District has galleries, museums, a restaurant and bar, and an ice cream store. Those wanting a sit-down lunch can do that at Al the Wop's, an infamous place built in 1915. It was founded by the first non-Chinese people in Locke. After a period of time, there will be a convoy to Grand Island and the J-Mack Ferry, which will take us across Steamboat Slough to East Ryer Island. This cable ferry is operated by CalTrans and is a 3 minute ride, six MVs at a time.



Then if the Real McCoy ferry is operating, an option will be to drive to it and take it across Cache Slough to a road that goes into Rio Vista. Then back to camp. If not operating there is another route back.

Sites are still available as of this writing. Send Jo-Ann the camping form, she will help you find a good site. Then book with Lighthouse. Reminder that Areas A, B, C sites have grass, much shade, water and power, but no sewer. RVers there can dump by the office on their way out, or back into any unused site in Area I or D to dump. Area I is grass, has full hookups, and most sites are sunny. **Wood or charcoal fire pits are not allowed** due to the danger of coals falling on the turf and the peat soil smoldering underground. Propane pits are allowed, as are wood or charcoal BBQs.

You may check out <https://www.lighthouse resort and marina.com/> and go to Resort>Rules to see their **animal policy** and whatever else might apply to you. **MVs are not counted for the purpose of the extra vehicle fee.** Also, we can **store our car hauler trailers on our sites.** Bigger equipment trailers must go in the Storage Yard. **Do not store trailers along the west perimeter road (bottom on the map).** That is for visitor parking. The **hardpan parking spot at the east end of Area B near the office is reserved for heavy MVs** that should not park on a grass campsite. You must ask Dave Ball or me for permission to park your MV there. My e-mail is in_garage@hotmail.com or phone 415-847-2801.

Lighthouse requires RVs to have a **surge protector**. There is info about this on the MVCC website calendar listing, see the Basic Training document. No parking on the lawns around the cabins due to sprinklers. We will ask if jeeps are included in that. Cabin renter parking is at the endcap of campsite island A, and by cabin L3.
